CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Junior
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown had a career day in the Flames' Big South victory over Charleston Southern. He finished the contest with a career-high 403 yards of total offense - the sixth-highest single-game total in Big South history, and was responsible for five of the team's six touchdowns. Brown threw for 310 yards and three touchdowns on 20-of-33 passing, and rushed 18 times for 93 yards and two scores. It was his second 300-yard passing game of the season, his third game this year with at least three touchdown passes, and he tied a school record by passing for more than 200 yards in his sixth-straight game.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CHARLES JAMES • DB • R-Sophomore
Charleston Southern • Jacksonville, Fla.

James tied the Big South Conference single-game record with a school-record three interceptions Saturday at Liberty, in addition to recording 10 total tackles (seven solo, three assisted) and four pass break-ups. James limited Chris Summers to just four receptions for 48 yards and no touchdowns when he was in the game (Summers' final reception, a 29-yard touchdown pass on fourth down with :28 seconds left was without James in the game). James now has five interceptions in his last two games.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

GERALD STEVENSON • RS • Senior
Charleston Southern • Naples, Fla.

Stevenson returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown at Liberty, his first career kickoff return touchdown and the second 100-yard kickoff return for a score in Big South history. Stevenson finished the day with three kickoff returns for 146 yards for an average of 48.7 yards per return, as well as 199 all-purpose yards.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

CHRIS MAYO • DB
Liberty • Neptune, N.J.

Mayo recorded six tackles (four solo, two assisted), one sack for minus-12 yards and forced two fumbles against Charleston Southern. He was second on the squad with his six stops, and his quarterback sack-fumble in the fourth quarter was recovered by the Flames and led to Liberty's go-ahead touchdown.

GOING FOR TWO

Defending Big South co-champions Liberty and Stony Brook opened their respective Conference seasons with wins this past Saturday. This coming weekend, the Flames will look to start 2-0 in Big South play for the fourth consecutive time, which would establish a League record. Liberty and Coastal Carolina (2004-05-06) are the lone Big South members with three-straight seasons opening Conference action 2-0.

THIRD-AND-TWO

Saturday will be the third and final week featuring Conference openers, as Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb begin their Big South schedules. Coastal Carolina is 5-2 in Big South openers, and will open its Big South slate on the road for the third time. The Chanticleers are 2-0 when opening the Conference season away from home. Gardner-Webb is 5-3 in League openers, an impressive figure considering that the Runnin' Bulldogs have never opened the Conference season at home.

BIG SOUTH KICKS OFF TELEVISION PACKAGE

The 2010 Big South Television package kicks off this Saturday and features Gardner-Webb at Charleston Southern live on ESPN3.com at 1:30pm ET. It is the first of a record eight Conference games that will be televised this season, and the first of three games airing on ESPN3.com. **MARK BRYANT** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action.

STILL BURNING

Liberty extended its Big South home Conference win streak record to 10 following its 44-20 win over Charleston Southern this past Saturday. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 460 points (46.0 points per game), while holding its League brethren to 154 points (15.4 average). The Buccaneers were the first Big South team to score 20 points against Liberty in Williams Stadium since 2007.

100% TOTAL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**'s 403 yards of total offense against Charleston Southern last Saturday is the sixth-highest single-game total in Big South history, and he is the first to surpass the 400-yard mark since Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** had 400 at Stony Brook on Nov. 1, 2008. It was Brown's fourth game with at least 300 yards of total offense in 2010, the third-most in a single-season. Brown now ranks fourth all-time in career 300-yard total offense games with five.

SEAWOLVES SWALLOW UP KEYDET RUNNING GAME

Stony Brook held VMI to just eight yards rushing on 22 attempts this past weekend, the second-lowest rushing yards allowed in a Big South game. The all-time record for fewest rushing yards allowed in a Big South contest is minus-1 yard, accomplished by Liberty at Charleston Southern on Nov. 1, 2003. That day, the Bucs finished on the negative side after 35 rushing attempts.

CENTENARIANS

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown last Saturday at Liberty, becoming the second player in Big South history to return one for a score from that distance. Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** was the first, and also did it against the Flames just last season on Nov. 14. It was Stevenson's first career kickoff return touchdown.

SUMMERS TIME

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 48 receptions for 633 yards and nine touchdowns. His nine TD catches are tied for the most by all FCS wide receivers. He ranks fourth in the country in receptions per game (8.00) and seventh in receiving yards per game (105.50). Summers is close to beginning just the sixth player in Big South history with 50 receptions and 10 receiving touchdowns in the same season, and is on pace for 88 catches, 1,161 receiving yards and 17 touchdowns this year. The Big South single-season record for each category is 103 receptions, 1,077 receiving yards and 16 touchdown catches. Stay tuned.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** moved into second-place on the Big South's career all-purpose yard list this past weekend, as he surpassed VMI's **SEAN MIZZER**, who had 4,621 all-purpose yards from 2003-06. Stevenson collected 199 yards at Liberty and increased his career total to 4,668. VMI's **TIM MAYRPAY** (2006-09) is the Big South's career leader with 6,129 all-purpose yards.

BIG TIME RUSH

Coastal Carolina RB **ERIC O'NEAL**, who ranks fourth in the League with 341 rushing yards, has led the Chanticleers in rushing in each of the team's five games, the lone Big South player with this distinction this season. Following O'Neal is Liberty's **MIKE BROWN**, who has been his team's top rusher in four of the Flames' six contests this year.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for 200 yards in each of his team's first six games of the season. Brown broke the record of four games that was established by Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** in 2005. Meanwhile, Brown has tied the school record for most consecutive games passing for 200 yards, joining **ROBBY JUSTINO** and **BROCK SMITH**. The last Big South quarterback to throw for more than 200 yards in seven-straight games was Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS**, who did it in eight consecutive games in 2006.

SIR CHARLES

Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** tied the Big South single-game record with three interceptions at Liberty this past weekend. He now has five picks in his last two outings, as he intercepted two passes at Hawai'i on Sept. 25. James' five interceptions this season are already tied for third-most in a single-season in Big South history.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 58 games. Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 46 games (28 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (27), Stony Brook (21) and Charleston Southern (13).

DOUBLE DOWN

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 21. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes. Stony Brook's current streak is tied for the fourth-longest in Big South history.

HEAD OF THIS CLASS

Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** is the only Big South QB to throw a touchdown pass in each of his team's games this season (five). Dating back to last season, Coulter has thrown a TD pass in his last six outings.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who surpassed 1,000 career passing yards in Week 2 and is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards, needs 65 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing plateau. That milestone would obviously make him the Conference's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. Brown has now thrown for 2,077 yards in his short stint as a quarterback, and has also amassed 1,041 receiving yards in his career.

BIG BROWN

Of his 14 touchdown passes this season, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown eight on third down and two on fourth down, while six have gone for at least 36 yards. In just seven career starts at quarterback, Brown is 149-of-220 passing (=67.7 percent) for 1,867 yards and 15 touchdowns, in addition to being 5-2. He also has rushed 94 times for 439 yards (4.7 average) and five scores starting under center.

STILL KICKIN'

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** is 141 kickoff return yards away from becoming the Big South's all-time leader in the category, as he trails **TIM MAYPRAY**'s Conference record of 2,181. Stevenson has 2,041 in his career, and also needs 13 more kickoff returns to break Maypray's Conference record of 98. Meanwhile, Stevenson, who became just the second player in Conference history with 2,000 combined kickoff/punt return yards in Week 2, now has 2,191 in his career (2,041 kickoffs, 150 punts) and is 302 yards away from Maypray's all-time mark of 2,492. In addition, Stevenson needs 249 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards.

A GAME OF CATCH

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is fifth in Big South history with 149 career receptions, and needs three to move past former VMI receiver **ZOHN BURDEN** (151) for fourth. Perry also is 33 yards away from cracking the League's top 10 in career receiving yards. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** is ninth with 131 career receptions, and needs 18 receiving yards to move into the League's all-time top 10. Stevenson is one of five players tied for 10th in League history with 12 career touchdown catches. Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** also has 12.

BIG MAC

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL**, who became the sixth player in Big South history with 30 career touchdown passes in Week 4, is now the eighth player in League annals with 5,000 yards of total offense. MacDowall eclipsed the milestone in Week 5 at No. 11 Richmond, and ranks eighth in Conference history with 5,158 yards (4,672 passing, 486 rushing). MacDowall needs 129 yards to pass VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON** (5,286) for seventh-place in Big South history.

KICK STAND

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** became the Big South's all-time leader in career field goals with his 41st career make this past weekend, a 26-yarder against Charleston Southern. Bevins, who is 41-of-56 in his career at Liberty, broke the previous record of 40 career field goals, which was established by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** from 2003-06. Hoke was 40-of-63 during his time in Conway. Not far behind Bevins is Hoke's successor, **JUSTIN DURHAM**, who has made 38 career field goals since arriving at Coastal in 2007. Meanwhile, Bevins also surpassed the 200-point plateau on Saturday, becoming just the fourth placekicker in Big South history with 200 career markers. He now has 206 career points kicking.

CATCHING UP

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS**, who became the 22nd player in Big South history to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards in Week 4, now stands at 1,250. He needs four receptions for 100 in his career. Summers was joined in the 1,000-yard receiving club in Week 5 when Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** (1,082) became the 23rd player to eclipse the milestone, and the duo was joined this past weekend by Charleston Southern's **KWAME KRAKUE** (1,014). Presbyterian College's **PATRICK McKOY** (944) is on the doorstep of 1,000 career receiving yards.

BABY BOOMER

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 43.2 yards per punt, including 44.7 in his last four games. This season, Morgano has booted seven of his 34 punts at least 50 yards -- including three at The Citadel in Week 3 as well as a 64-yarder at VMI in Week 5 that is tied for the fifth-longest in Big South history. Just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** (43.5 in 2006). The last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Hanna in 2007 (40.6).

BULL DURHAM

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** is three points away from becoming just the fifth placekicker in Big South history with 200 career points. Durham has made 38 field goals (third-most in Big South record books) and 83 point-after kicks.

HEIR APPARENT

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** recorded his 10th career 100-yard rushing game with his 101-yard effort in Week 4 against UMass. Gowins is just the fifth player in Big South history to reach the century mark in a game 10 times. Gowins also surpassed Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343) for seventh-place on the League's all-time rushing list with 2,355 career yards. Former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY** holds the sixth position at 2,456. Gowins is 1,279 yards away from breaking the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**.

RUSHING UPDATE

Charleston Southern's **DeMARCUS MOON** joined the Big South's career 1,000-yard rushing club in Week 4, becoming the third Buccaneer to reach the milestone since the League started football in 2002, and the seventh CSU player overall. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has rushed for a touchdown in each of his last four games (seven total) and is tied for fifth in Big South history with 22 career rushing touchdowns. All but seven of his 22 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 31.0 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3 - 8).

BROWN ADDED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

On Monday, Oct. 4, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** was one of four players added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the Watch List since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. The Payton Award Watch List will be revised again on Oct. 25 before the final ballot is sent out to voters on Nov. 22.

FIRE BALL

Liberty has allowed just three rushing touchdowns this season, the fewest among the Big South football members. The Flames' defense has not allowed a rushing score in the past three games, a span of 109 rushing attempts.

THE LAST ONE STANDING

Gardner-Webb is the only Big South member to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South Conference game, a span of 34 contests. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 31 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

CROWDED HOUSE

Liberty opened the newly refurbished and expanded 19,200-seat Williams Stadium in Week 5 with a resounding 52-14 win over Savannah State in front of 19,314 fans -- a Williams Stadium and Big South Conference single-game attendance record. The previous record was 16,112 for last year's game against North Carolina Central on Sept. 12. A crowd of 18,587 attended this past weekend's game against Charleston Southern -- setting the attendance record for a Big South game. The previous high for a Conference game was 15,208 for the VMI at Liberty game on Nov. 7, 2009.

THREE BALL

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** became the seventh player in Big South history with three touchdown receptions in a game during Week 5 against Savannah State. The last Big South player with this accomplishment was Stony Brook's **DWAYNE ELEY** on Oct. 25, 2008 at Coastal Carolina. Summers was the first Liberty player with three receiving TDs in a game since **DANIEL THOMAS** had three against Wingate in 2001.

DAILY DOUBLE

Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** is the first Chanticleer to catch two touchdown passes in back-to-back games since **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2007. In Week 5, VMI's **MARIO SCOTT** was the first Keydet to score two touchdowns receiving since **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** did it in 2008.

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is now fourth all-time in Big South history with 322 career stops. Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.
