### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Junior**  
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown set a Big South single-game record with 494 yards of total offense in Liberty's 54-28 victory over Stony Brook, leading the Flames to a share of the Big South football championship. He gained a career-high 160 yards on the ground and scored two rushing touchdowns, and completed 20-of-31 passes for 334 and two scores -- becoming the first player in League history to rush for 150 yards and pass for 300 yards in the same game. Brown also became the first quarterback in Big South history to pass for more than 200 yards in every game in a season, as well as the first to surpass 400 yards of total offense three times in one campaign.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**COASTAL CAROLINA DEFENSE**

The Chanticleers defense limited Charleston Southern to three points and 218 yards of offense -- including just 33 in the second half, en route to a share of the Big South title and claiming the Conference's first-ever automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. Coastal Carolina posted 11.0 tackles for loss of 30 yards -- three of which were sacks, forced two fumbles, recovered two fumbles, returned an interception for a touchdown for the third time in the past four games, and did not allow a third down conversion in the final 30 minutes.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MATT BEVINS • K • Junior**  
Liberty • Newport News, Va.

Bevins set a Big South single-game record with 18 points scored against Stony Brook as he connected on 4-of-4 field goals and 6-of-6 point-after attempts. He was successful on distances of 26, 25, 50 and 42 yards in recording his fourth career game with four field goals (Big South record). Bevins also became the first kicker in League history to make two field goals from 50 yards-or-longer in one season, and notched his 11th career 10-point kicking game, which is another Conference record.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO • PR**  
Coastal Carolina • Ortonville, Mich.

Mastromatteo set three Big South punt return records against Charleston Southern. He returned four punts for a single-game record 125 yards (31.3 average), including a 91-yard return for a touchdown -- the longest punt return in Big South history. Mastromatteo ended the regular-season with 29 punt returns, breaking the Big South single-season record of 26.

**BIG SOUTH'S FIRST AUTOMATIC BID AWARDED TO COASTAL CAROLINA**

The Big South Conference's first-ever automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs has been awarded to Coastal Carolina University, it was determined following the completion of the regular-season on Saturday. The Chanticleers defeated Charleston Southern, 70-3, and coupled with Liberty's 54-28 victory over Stony Brook, Coastal, Liberty and SBU finished in a three-way tie for first-place at 5-1 -- the first three-way tie in the League's nine-year football history.

The Big South's first three tiebreakers were not enough to break the three-way tie, therefore, the fourth step -- Points allowed in Conference games -- was the determining factor. The Chanticleers finished the six-game Big South schedule with 109 points allowed, ahead of Stony Brook (122) and Liberty (138). Stony Brook entered the final weekend with a 38-point margin on Coastal Carolina with 68 points allowed, while the Chanticleers held a four-point advantage on Liberty, 106-to-110. The Flames were eliminated from the automatic bid race when Coastal's game went final.

**CHANTICLEERS MAKING SECOND PLAYOFF APPEARANCE, WILL HOST WESTERN ILLINOIS**

Coastal Carolina is making the second playoff appearance in both school and Big South history, as the Chanticleers received an at-large berth in 2006. After picking up the Conference's first-ever automatic bid, the Chants will host Western Illinois of the Missouri Valley Football Conference in the first round -- becoming the first Big South team to host a postseason game. Coastal Carolina is 0-1 in the FCS Playoffs, falling at eventual national champion Appalachian State in 2006.

**THREE'S COMPANY**

As mentioned above, three teams finished as the Big South's football champion for the first time. It is the second consecutive season that co-champions have been crowned and the third time overall. Both Liberty and Coastal Carolina have laid claim to their fourth Big South football title, with the Flames winning theirs in succession -- the first program to do so. Meanwhile, it was the Seawolves' second consecutive co-championship.

**THE TREND CONTINUES...**

The winner of the previous seven Coastal Carolina-Liberty match-ups has won or shared the Big South football Championship. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Both shared the 2010 title.

**THAT 70s SHOW**

Coastal Carolina is the first team in Big South history to score 70 points in a game twice, as the Chants were the first team to do so in 2005 against Mansfield (71 points). The Chanticleers' 70 points against Charleston Southern in the regular-season finale was the third-highest total scored in a single-game, and the second-most in a Conference clash. That record is 73 points, which was accomplished by Liberty against VMI in 2007.

**SAND TRAP**

One week after Stony Brook set the Big South record for largest margin of victory in a Conference game (52 points in a 55-3 win over Gardner-Webb), Coastal Carolina shattered the mark by 15 points with its 67-point win over Charleston Southern this past Saturday.

**ANOTHER FIRST FOR LIBERTY'S MIKE BROWN**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season, as he threw for 334 yards in the season finale against Stony Brook. Brown's 11 games (all consecutive) breaks the old record of 10 that was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006.

**TOTAL RECALL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** set a Big South single-game record with 494 yards of total offense in the season finale against Stony Brook. It was Brown's third game over 400 yards -- a record for a single-season and career. Brown is first in the nation in total offense with a Big South single-season record of 346.4 yards per game. The old record was 329.3, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** during Coastal Carolina's 2006 playoff season. Brown's 3,810 total offensive yards this season as well as his seven total 300-yard total offense games are second-most in a campaign in League history. Thigpen holds both records with 3,952 yards of total offense and nine 300-yard total offensive games during 12 games in 2006.

**HOME ON THE RANGE**

Liberty was the only Big South team to go undefeated in home games this season, as the Flames finished 5-0. The Conference has had at least one team finish with a perfect home record every season of Big South football.

**STRONG FINISHES**

Coastal Carolina closed out the regular-season with four consecutive wins, continuing a streak in the Big South that has occurred every year since the League's first season in 2002. Last season, Charleston Southern rolled off four-straight wins to end the season, a streak the Bucs also pulled off to close out 2008. In 2007, Liberty ended the year with five consecutive wins, while in 2006 it was Coastal Carolina winning eight consecutive games en route to an at-large playoff berth. The 2005 season saw Charleston Southern end the year with five-straight wins. The year prior had Coastal Carolina (eight) and Liberty (four) end the 2004 campaign with at least a four-game win streak. In 2003 the Flames were victorious in their final four games of the season, and Gardner-Webb started it all as winners of its last eight games in 2002.

**CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE WON IN NOVEMBER**

Coastal Carolina is 19-6 (=76.0) in its history during the final month of the season, while Liberty is 20-8 (=71.4) since 2002. Stony Brook is 5-3 in November since joining the Big South in 2008. With its victory at VMI in Week 10, Coastal Carolina is the only Big South member to win a game in November every season since 2003.

**WELCOME TO THE CLUB**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South history to rush for 150 yards and pass for 300 yards in the same game, as he finished with 160 yards on the ground and 334 yards through the air in the Flames' season finale against Stony Brook. It was his second game this season with 100 rushing yards/100 passing yards, becoming the first QB in League annals to achieve this benchmark twice in one year. Brown joins Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** and VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** as the only quarterbacks with two career 100-yard rushing/100-yard passing games.

**BIG FIVE**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** threw five touchdown passes against Charleston Southern in the regular-season finale, the most touchown passes in a Conference game and tying the overall Big South single-game record. MacDowall is the third different quarterback in League history to throw five TDs in a game, joining Gardner-Webb's **JEREMY MARTIN** (2002) and Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (2004 and 2006).

**HERE COMES PAT**

Liberty WR **PAT KELLY** set the Big South single-game record for receiving yards with 235 in the Flames' season finale against Stony Brook. Filling in for the injured **CHRIS SUMMERS**, Kelly hauled in a career-high 10 passes, including two touchdowns of 65 yards and 79 yards in length -- the second player in Big South history with two touchdown grabs of at least 65 yards in the same game (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** was the first in 2007). Kelly's 235 receiving yards surpassed the old Conference record of 210 yards that was established by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** against Wofford in 2005.

**BIG MAC RUSHING ATTACK**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** has rushed for a touchdown in six-straight games, tying the Big South record for a quarterback that was established by Charleston Southern signal-caller **COLLIN DRAFTS** in 2005. MacDowall has 16 career rushing touchdowns, the fourth-most by a quarterback in Big South history.

**A BIG PUP**

Gardner-Webb true freshman DE **PRESTON PEMASA** finished the season as the Big South's sack leader with 7.0, becoming the first frosh in League history to lead the Conference in sacks. Pemasa also broke the freshman sack record of 6.5 that was set by Coastal Carolina's **ADRIN GRADY** in 2003.

**THAT'S A FACT, ZACH**

In his last three games, Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** is 58-of-81 passing (=71.6 percent) for 884 yards and 10 touchdowns, compared to just one interception. His recent output has vaulted him up the Conference's career passing charts, as he is fifth in League history with 45 career scoring strikes, is the fifth quarterback in League annals with 6,000 career passing yards (6,068) and fifth in Conference history with 6,776 career total offensive yards. MacDowall enters the FCS Playoffs needing 224 yards to become the fifth Big South player with 7,000 career yards of offense. His 1,036 career offensive plays are fifth-most in the Conference record books.

**SUPER SIZED COMBO**

Already the second pair of teammates in Big South history to rush for 1,000 yards in the same season, Stony Brook running backs **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (1,128) and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (1,029) are the first pair of teammates to finish 1-2 in the Big South in season rushing yards. The duo also combined for 10 100-yard rushing games this season (Jackolski - 6, Maysonet - 4) and surpassed 100 yards in the same game three times.

**A LOT TO A LITTLE**

Of the 21 Big South Conference games played this season, 17 were decided by at least 10 points -- a League record for most Big South games decided by double figures in a season. The previous record was 10, which was established in 2009 during a 21-game League slate. Ten of this year's Conference games were decided by at least 20 points, and the average winning margin for the Big South season was 20.8 points -- the highest in League history.

**CLEAN SLATE**

Presbyterian College snapped its 10-game home losing streak with its 42-6 win over Davidson in the season finale at Bailey Memorial Stadium. It was the Blue Hose's first victory since defeating Liberty 31-28 in a non-Conference game in 2008. PC has one more losing streak to end -- a six-game home Conference game skid.

**JACK-OF-ALL-TRADES**

Stony Brook's **BROCK JACKOLSKI** just missed the Big South single-season record for all-purpose yards, as he finished the 2010 season with 1,966 -- falling nine yards shy of the mark of 1,975 that was established by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2007. Jackolski returned six kickoffs for 207 yards this past Saturday at Liberty -- the third-most kickoff return yards in a game. In Week 11 against Gardner-Webb, Jackolski became the first player in Big South history to score a rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown and a kickoff return touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the feat all in succession and all in the third quarter. Jackolski returned the opening kickoff of the second half 94 yards for a score, and followed with a 6-yard TD catch and a 19-yard scoring run.

**DOUBLED UP**

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive League games scoring in double figures at 28. The Flames broke the record of 26 games that was established by VMI from Oct. 4, 2003 - Oct. 10, 2009. Meanwhile, Liberty and VMI have not been shutout in Big South play. The Flames have scored in all 40 of their Big South games since 2002, while the Keydets have tallied points in all 37 of their Big South contests since joining in 2003.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty also owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 63 games, which is the second-longest in League history. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 52 games (34 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (33), Stony Brook (27) and Charleston Southern (19).

**DOUBLE DOWN**

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 27, the fourth-longest streak in Big South history. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes.

**COASTING**

Coastal Carolina scored 363 points this season -- its most since scoring 411 during its 2006 playoff season. The Chanticleers scored 115 points in their last two Conference games, a record for the most points scored in back-to-back Big South contests. The previous mark was 110 points, which was accomplished by Liberty in 2007 (37 vs. Coastal Carolina on Nov. 3 and 73 vs. VMI on Nov. 10).

**SUMMERS TIME**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** set the Big South single-season records for receiving yards and receiving yards per game, while tying the season mark for most games with 100 receiving yards. Summers' 1,081 receiving yards this season surpassed the old mark of 1,077 that was set by Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006. Summers' six 100-yard receiving games equaled **MAURICE PRICE**'s record with Charleston Southern in 2005, and his 108.1 yards per game average shattered Simpson's 89.8 clip from 2006. Summers' 15 touchdown receptions this season are second-most in a campaign.

**HIGH RATE OF RETURN**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** departs as the Big South's all-time leader for combined kick return yardage at 2,649 (2,449 kickoffs, 200 punts), as well as the all-time leader in kickoff return yards and most kickoff returns with 102. Stevenson ends his career second in Conference history with 5,684 career all-purpose yards.

**SIXTY MINUTES**

Gardner-Webb redshirt-junior WR **JAMES PERRY III** is the second player in Big South history with two 60-reception seasons, joining former Charleston Southern wideout **MAURICE PRICE**, who accomplished the feat in 2005 and 2006. With 181 career catches, Perry is on track to break Price's Big South career record of 202 receptions next season.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** rushed for 854 yards this season, the second-highest single-season rushing total for a quarterback in League history. In addition, his 2,956 passing yards is the second-most in a campaign as well. Brown threw at least three TD passes in a game four times this season, just two away from the Big South single-season record of six, and his 23 touchdown passes this year are tied for second-most in a season in League history. He was the first player in Big South history to throw three touchdown passes in three consecutive games earlier this season during Weeks 5-7. In Week 9 at Presbyterian College, Brown became the Big South's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards, and he will enter his final season in 2011 with 1,438 career rushing yards, 3,408 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

**BECOMING AN INFERNO**

Liberty extended its Big South-record Conference home winning streak to 12 games with its 54-28 victory over Stony Brook in the season finale. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 554 points (46.2 points per game), has scored more than 30 points in each contest and has held its League brethren to 196 points (16.3 average).

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty redshirt-junior **CHRIS SUMMERS** will enter the 2011 season with 124 career receptions for 1,698 yards and 19 touchdowns, and is one TD grab away from becoming the fourth Big South player with 20 career touchdown catches. Summers also is three catches away from cracking the League's top 10. Summers caught a touchdown pass in eight of 10 games this year, including five multi-TD receiving games -- matching the Big South single-season record that was first set by Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006.

**BIG BROWN**

In just 12 career starts at quarterback, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is 252-of-387 passing ( =65.1 percent) for 3,198 yards and 24 touchdowns, in addition to being 9-3. He also has rushed 180 times for 942 yards (5.2 average) and 10 scores starting under center. Brown's 160 rushing yards vs. Stony Brook in the season finale was the second-highest single-game total by a quarterback in Big South history.

**FAVORITE TOPPINGS**

Liberty is the first team in Big South history to lead the Conference in scoring offense in consecutive seasons. The Flames led the Big South in both scoring offense (36.5) and scoring defense (20.2) in 2010, a feat they accomplished in 2007 and 2009. Liberty has now finished as the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented fifth-straight year.

**50-50 RAFFLE**

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** booted his third career field goal from 50 yards-or-longer in the season finale against Stony Brook, setting a Big South record for most career 50-yard field goals (3) and most in a season (2). Bevins, who connected on his last 13 consecutive field goals, was 4-of-4 against the Seawolves -- his League record fourth game with four field goals -- and finished the day with a Big South kick scoring record 18 points against Stony Brook. The Conference's all-time leader with 54 career field goals, Bevins is 54-of-69 in career field goals at Liberty ( =78.3), and ranks second in Big South history with 268 career points kicking as well as fourth in overall scoring. He will enter the 2011 season needing 30 points to break the Big South career record of 297 points kicking, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history.

**BULL DURHAM**

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** became Coastal Carolina's all-time leader in career field goals when he made a career-long 46-yarder in Week 11 against Liberty. It was his 41st career field goal, breaking **JOSH HOKE**'s school-record of 40. Of Durham's 41 career field goals, 10 have been 40 yards-or-longer. Coupled with 113 point-after kicks, Durham has 236 career points.

**SOMETHING SPECIAL**

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 36 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

**TACKLE BOX**

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, finishes his career fourth all-time in Big South history with 345 career stops.

**BRAVO MASTROMATTEO**

Coastal Carolina freshman punt returner **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** set three Big South records in the season finale against Charleston Southern. He returned four punts for a single-game record 125 yards, including a 91-yard return for a touchdown -- the longest punt return in Big South history. Mastromatteo ended the season with 29 punt returns, breaking the Big South single-season record of 26 that was set by Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** in 2006.

**BROWN ON PAYTON AWARD BALLOT**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is an official candidate on the Walter Payton Award ballot, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the ballot since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. Voting begins Monday, Nov. 22.

**STONE COLD**

Stony Brook is the first team in Big South history to hold three Conference opponents to less than 10 points in the same season. The Seawolves permitted just nine points to VMI in Week 6, seven to Presbyterian College in Week 10 and three to Gardner-Webb in Week 11. SBU held PC and GWU under 10 points in back-to-back games, the second Big South team to accomplish this feat. In 2008, Liberty shut out two consecutive League foes.

**CUNNINGHAM HARDWARE**

Coastal Carolina's **KEON CUNNINGHAM** is the Big South's all-time leader in career interception return yardage with 225. He has intercepted eight passes in his career and has returned two of them for touchdowns -- tied for the most INT return touchdowns in Big South history. As a team, Coastal Carolina returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2010 (three in the last four weeks of the season), tying the Big South single-season record.

**FOUR FRESHMAN ENJOY A WEEKEND TO REMEMBER**

Four freshman football players turned in some memorable performances during Week 11. Stony Brook freshman DB **DAVONTE ANDERSON** set a Big South single-game record with four interceptions against Gardner-Webb. The previous single-game mark was three picks, which was done five previous times, including twice this season. Against Liberty, Coastal Carolina's **MATT HAZEL** became the second freshman in Big South history to catch three touchdown passes in a game, while Charleston Southern's **MALCOM DIXON** was the first freshman since **COLLIN DRAFTS** in 2003 and second in League history to throw four touchdown passes in a game. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College freshman QB **RYAN SINGER** was the first player to throw two 50-yard touchdown passes in the same game since Charleston Southern's **SIDNEY BRYANT** in 2007, and was the first freshman to accomplish this feat. At Charleston Southern in Week 11, Singer first connected on a 53-yard scoring play with **JEREMY COLE**, and later teamed with **MICHAEL RUFF** for a 54-yard touchdown pass.

**GOOD WORK YOUNG MAN**

Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

**IT'S ACADEMIC**

Presbyterian College OL **JARED TAVERNIER** and Charleston Southern LB **BRAD SWEATT** were named to the 2010 *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District III team. The All-District team is comprised of Division I student-athletes in both FBS and FCS, and the Big South has had multiple All-District honorees every year since starting football in 2002.

**TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South played a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE**

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.

\* The 2007 season was also the last time that CSU finished with an overall record below .500, and ended this season with a loss after having ended the last two seasons with four-straight wins.

\* The Bucs were held without a touchdown in the season finale at Coastal Carolina, the first time since playing at South Florida last season that Charleston Southern failed to reach the end zone in a game (19-game span).

\* Charleston Southern suffered its largest margin of defeat in school history in the season finale at Coastal Carolina.

\* Freshman **JOURVONTAE PHIPPS** had a career-high seven tackles in the season-ending loss at Coastal. He also recorded his first tackle-for-loss of the season.

\* DL **JOEL WALTON** had a season-best 2.5 TFL against the Chanticleers.

\* **DeMARCUS MOON** ends his career with 1,363 career rushing yards, good for 23rd all-time in the Big South record books.

\* Freshman QB **MALCOM DIXON** finished the season 21-of-27 passing ( =77.8 percent) for 236 yards and four touchdowns, with no interceptions. He recorded a 200.09 passing efficiency rating and had the team's longest rush of the year -- 30 yards.

\* Coastal Carolina meets Western Illinois for the first time on Saturday. The Chanticleers are 0-1 in the FCS Playoffs, having lost to eventual national champion Appalachian State in 2006.

\* Coastal Carolina is 35-4 all-time when rushing for 200 yards in a game, as the Chanticleers gained 209 in the regular-season finale against Charleston Southern.

\* **JEREMY HEIGHT** had a 78-yard kickoff return against the Buccaneers, the third-longest in school history.

\* **TRE HENDERSON** picked off his first career pass and returned it 66 yards for a touchdown against Charleston Southern. It was the second-longest INT return in school history.

\* The Chanticleers did not allow a sack to the Buccaneers, marking the fourth time this season they kept their quarterback from going down behind the line.

\* K **JUSTIN DURHAM** is the second kicker in Big South history with 10 PATs in a game (vs. Charleston Southern), extending his streak to 30 consecutive successful attempts. He opened the season making just 10-of-14 through five games.

\* QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** completed seven of his first nine passes against CSU and ended the game completing eight of his final nine attempts. His 15 completions went to eight different receivers.

\* WR **BRANDON WHITLEY** needs one reception for 100 in his career. His 13 career touchdown catches are tied for 10th-most in Big South history.

\* WR **JAMES PERRY III** caught a 27-yard touchdown between two defenders in the season finale against VMI, which turned out to be the game-winner. He finished the season with a career-high 65 receptions.

\* The Runnin' Bulldogs picked off a season-high four passes against VMI, including two in the end zone.

\* Gardner-Webb's seven losses this season are the most since going 2-9 in 1996 and the first time with more than six losses since that same season.

\* RB **PATRICK HALL** ends his career ranked 12th all-time in Big South history with 1,834 rushing yards. His 27 career rushing touchdowns rank third in Gardner-Webb history.

\* The Flames' 54-point outburst against Stony Brook in the season finale pushed their season total over 400 points for the third consecutive season.

\* Liberty has now won eight-straight games at Williams Stadium, during which the Flames have scored 40-or-more points in each contest while averaging 50.2 points in that span.

\* RB **SirCHAUNCEY HOLLOWAY** will enter his junior season of 2011 needing 191 yards for 1,000 in his career. He has 17 career rushing touchdowns -- eight of which came in the final seven games of this season.

\* QB **MIKE BROWN** finished the season as Liberty's single-season total offensive yard record holder with 3,810 yards. His 2,956 passing yards this season is fourth-most in program history.

\* The 10 points allowed Gardner-Webb in the season finale were the fewest allowed an opponent in a Big South game since VMI scored a 10-7 win over Liberty on Oct. 1, 2005.

\* VMI held Gardner-Webb to 218 yards of total offense in the season finale, which was the third-lowest total offense yardage allowed an opponent this year. The Keydets allowed 194 yards to Lock Haven and 205 yards against Presbyterian College.

\* The 59 rushing yards allowed Gardner-Webb Saturday was the lowest by a VMI opponent this season.

\* LB **A.J. GROSS** produced his sixth double-digit tackle game of the year with 13 tackles at Gardner-Webb. Gross also finished with 1.0 TFL (-2). He tallied 110 tackles this season and is looking to become the first Keydet to lead the Big South in total tackles since **JUSTIN HUGGARD** had a League-high 136 in 2005.

\* K **JEFF SEXTON** finished the season with 47 career PATs, which places him eighth on the VMI list.

\* Freshman QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** did not see action against Gardner-Webb Saturday as he was held out after sustaining a knee strain the previous week against Old Dominion. Redshirt-junior **CAM JONES** started and was replaced by redshirt-freshman **ADAM MORGAN** on the third VMI series and finished the game.
