Holloway averaged 7.4 yards per carry and scored on runs of 2, 1, 2 and a long of 32 yards against the Panthers.

**COASTAL CAROLINA RETURNS TO TOP 25 RANKINGS**

Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 24 in the nation in this week's FCS Coaches poll, the program's first national ranking since being ranked No. 20/23 in the 2007 preseason national polls. The last time the Chanticleers were ranked in the Top 25 during the regular season was the week of Nov. 20, 2006. With Liberty ranked the first four weeks of the 2011 season, this marks just the second time in Conference history that two Big South football teams were ranked in the Top 25 in the same season.

**TIS THE CONFERENCE SEASON**

The Conference portion of the 2011 schedule kicks off this Saturday, Oct. 8, with six of the seven League members in action. Charleston Southern has its open date this weekend and will play its Big South opener next Saturday. Below is a breakdown of how each squad has fared in its respective Conference opener, as well as some additional notes:

Charleston Southern will open Big South play on the road for the third-straight season and sixth time overall (0-5) ... Coastal Carolina has finished the season with a .500 record-or-better when winning its Conference opener ... Gardner-Webb is opening League play against Liberty for the first time since 2006 and the fourth time overall ... Liberty is averaging 48.8 points in its last four Big South openers ... Presbyterian College's first official Conference game was Oct. 3, 2009 at Stony Brook ... Stony Brook carries a seven-game home Big South win streak into its 2011 opener ... VMI is opening League play at Coastal Carolina for the first time.

**BIG SOUTH'S TV PACKAGE DEBUTS WITH SATURDAY'S CONFERENCE OPENERS**

The Big South's television package also kicks off this weekend with two games on the slate. Liberty at Gardner-Webb will open this year's TV coverage, as the 4:00pm game will be carried live exclusively on ESPN3.com. **PATRICK KINAS** (play-by-play) and **RALPH PATTERSON** (analyst) will call the action from Boiling Springs. At 7:00pm, MASN will air live the VMI at Coastal Carolina game, with **TOM WERME** (play-by-play) and **ROD SMITH** (analyst) on the call.

**DUSTING OFF THE CONFERENCE STREAK RECORD BOOK**

As Conference play begins Saturday, Coastal Carolina carries the longest active Big South game win streak into this weekend's action at four games. As mentioned above, Stony Brook has won its last seven Conference home games -- the third-longest streak in Big South history (Liberty holds the mark with its current streak of 12 consecutive home League wins). The Flames have scored 30 points in each of their last 10 Big South contests, and join VMI, Stony Brook and Presbyterian College as the members to have never been shut out in a Big South game.

**FOUR SCORE AND SEVEN DAYS AGO**

One week after Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** tied a Big South single-game record with four rushing touchdowns against Lafayette, Liberty's **SIRCHAUNCEY HOLLOWAY** accomplished the feat this past weekend against Kentucky Wesleyan -- marking the first time the Big South has had two players rush for four touchdowns in back-to-back weeks. Holloway, who is the fifth player in League history with a 4-rushing touchdown game, is the second Flame to do it, as **EUGENE GOODMAN** was the first on Oct. 4, 2003 vs. VMI.

**AGENT P**

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** needs five receptions to break the Big South career record of 202, which is held by former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE** (2004-06). Perry has 198 and is second among active players in career receptions in the Football Championship Subdivision, trailing Butler's **ZACH WATKINS**, who has 213.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty has set the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 68, breaking the old mark of 67 that was established by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 56 games (38 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (37) and Stony Brook (31).

**LITTLE BIG MAN**

Gardner-Webb RB **KENNY LITTLE** rushed for a career-high 162 yards this past Saturday at Samford, the most by a Runnin' Bulldog rusher since **PHILIP PEOPLES** gained 176 against Presbyterian College on Oct. 18, 2008.

**HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF**

Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** is two receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions. Duran has 58 career catches, just one shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER**'s Conference record of 59 from 2007-10. Meanwhile, Duran is 180 yards away from becoming the first Big South tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards.

**FIRE STARTER**

Liberty held Kentucky Wesleyan to eight net rushing yards this past Saturday, the fewest the Flames have allowed since limiting Charleston Southern to minus-1 net rushing yards on Nov. 1, 2003. It was the fewest allowed by a Big South member since last season when Stony Brook held VMI to eight net rushing yards on Oct. 9, 2010. Meanwhile, Liberty held KWC to 74 total offensive yards, the fifth-fewest allowed in a single-game in Big South history. It was the first time a Big South squad held an opponent to under 100 yards of offense since Oct. 24, 2009, when Gardner-Webb limited Southern Virginia to 91 total yards.

**4x1,000-YARD RELAY TEAM**

Liberty is close to having four active players with 1,000 career receiving yards, as WR **PAT KELLY** is 114 yards away from the milestone. Once Kelly reaches the mark, he will join **CHRIS SUMMERS** (2,096), **B.J. HAYES** (1,064) and **MIKE BROWN** (1,049) in the career 1,000-yard receiving club.

**BIG SIRs**

Liberty RB **SIRCHAUNCEY HOLLOWAY**'s career-high four rushing touchdowns this past Saturday against Kentucky Wesleyan pushed his career total to 21 -- tied for ninth in Big South history with former Coastal Carolina FB **MIKE TOLBERT** (2004-07). Holloway is the fourth Liberty player with at least 20 rushing touchdowns on the Conference's all-time career list.

**ZEROES ON THE BOARD**

Liberty's 57-0 blanking of Kentucky Wesleyan College this past weekend was the first shutout recorded by a Big South program since Oct. 24, 2009 when Gardner-Webb shut out Southern Virginia, 65-0. The Flames also notched their seventh shutout under head coach **DANNY ROCCO**.

**NORTH BY NORTHWEST**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** recorded his third 100-yard rushing game in four weeks as he gained 194 against Lafayette in Week 4. It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game with the Seawolves, tied for ninth all-time in Big South history with former SBU rusher **CONTE CUTTINO** (2008-09). Maysonet leads the Big South with 542 rushing yards, and is fourth nationally with 135.5 rushing yards per game.

**300-TACKLE CLUB ACCEPTING NEW MEMBERS**

VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS** is seven tackles away from becoming the ninth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. He is the League's active leading-tackler with 293 career stops, ahead of teammate **BYRON ALLEN** (243). Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON** has 17 tackles in his first two games back from injury to push his career total to 238. Patterson is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Big South's 300-tackle list.

**SOLO ARTIST**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** recorded 12 solo tackles against Furman in Week 4, pushing his career total to 163 and into a tie for fourth-place in Big South history with former Gardner-Webb DB **DANIEL COOKE** (2005-08). Bethel, who became the second defensive player in Big South history with two touchdowns in a game in Week 3, needs four solo stops for second-place.

**MORE SOLO ACTS**

Charleston Southern DB **CHRIS KUZDALE** leads the Big South with 33 solo tackles and surpassed 100 career solo stops in Week 4 against Norfolk State. He stands at 112. Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN** and VMI LB **A.J. GROSS** also eclipsed the century mark for career solo tackles in Week 4. Norman's career total is 103 while Gross is at 102. Norman's teammate **MARCUS LOTT** is three shy of 100 career solo tackles.

**WOLF TRAP**

Stony Brook leads the Big South in rushing defense at 78.8 rushing yards allowed and is sixth in the nation in the category. The Seawolves have held three of its first four opponents under 100 yards rushing, a feat last accomplished in the Big South by Gardner-Webb and Liberty through the first four games of 2008.

**HOME EQUITY**

Stony Brook is just the third team in Big South football history to play four consecutive home games in a single-season, joining the 2005 Liberty Flames and 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Liberty went 0-4 during its streak, while the Buccaneers were 4-0 during their four-game home stand. The Seawolves are 1-1 on thus far. Stay tuned.

**THE MARGINS ARE OUR FRIENDS**

Liberty's 57-point win over Kentucky Wesleyan this past weekend was the eight-largest margin of victory in a single-game in Big South history. It was the Flames' largest victory point margin since defeating St. Francis (Pa.) by 58 points in a 68-10 win over the Red Flash on Sept. 29, 2007.

**HEY NORM!**

Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN** is tied for second in Big South history with 38 passes defended (11 INT, 27 PBU). His 27 pass break-ups rank third in League annals. Former Chanticleers safety **QUINTON TEAL** (2003-06) is the all-time leader in all three categories -- 48 PD, 17 INT, 31 PBU.

**THE FIRST FOUR**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET**'s 542 rushing yards in the first four games of the season is the most by a Big South player since former Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** gained 542 through the first four games of 2006. Two years later during his rushing record-setting season of 2008, Jennings had 429 yards rushing after four games before finishing with an all-time League-best 1,500. Meanwhile, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**'s 1,083 passing yards after four games this season is the most by a Conference quarterback since he threw for 1,084 yards in the same span last year. In addition, Brown's 84 pass completions thus far is the most after four contests since he completed 86 in 2010. Lastly, Brown's 1,302 yards of total offense in the first four games of the year are the most since former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** accumulated 1,321 during the first four games of 2006.

Liberty's **SIRCHAUNCEY HOLLOWAY** is 20 yards away from becoming the 35th Big South player with 1,000 career rushing yards.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He currently stands at 1,657 career rushing yards, 4,491 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is third in Big South history with 23 career touchdown receptions, and is seven TD grabs shy of becoming the third player with 30. Summers is currently seventh in League history with 150 career catches and needs two receptions for the sixth spot. He became the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4 (now at 2,096), and is 45 yards from moving into fifth all-time. Since the start of the 2010 season, Summers has 102 receptions, 1,479 yards and 19 touchdowns in 15 games played.

**AIR MAIL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season in 2010, has surpassed that yardage total in 15 consecutive games after passing for 297 yards in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh. In just 16 career starts at quarterback, Brown has thrown for more than 200 yards in each contest, is 336-of-515 passing (=65.2 percent) for 4,281 yards and 31 touchdowns, in addition to being 10-6.

**SECOND FIDDLE?**

Three of the seven Big South teams have scored at least 60 percent of their points this season in the second half. Charleston Southern has scored 68.3 percent of its points in the last 30 minutes (43 of 63), while VMI has scored 39 of its 60 points in the second half (=65.0 percent), including 36 points in the final 15 minutes of the game. Stony Brook has tallied 55 of its 88 points in the second stanza (= 62.5 percent).

**RHODES CONSTRUCTION**

Gardner-Webb kickoff/punt returner **RICKY RHODES** is fourth in the nation in punt return average at 19.8, which is pacing ahead of the Big South single-season record of 18.1 set by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2008. Gardner-Webb has not had a player average 10.0 yards per punt return (based on 1.2 returns per game) since 2005 when **KORY ALSTON** averaged 16.5 on his punt returns.

**COULTER PERSONALITY**

Stony Brook starting QB **MICHAEL COULTER** has suffered a season-ending injury and will miss the remainder of his senior season. In 26 career games with the Seawolves, Coulter is 10th in Big South history with 4,218 career passing yards and eighth with 32 career touchdown passes.

**EXPRESS DELIVERY**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is seventh in Big South history with 34 career touchdown passes and is six-scoring strikes away from becoming the sixth player with 40. Brown has thrown a TD pass in each of his first four games this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at seven. The last Big South QB with seven-straight games with a TD pass was Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** (final game of 2009 and first six games of 2010).

**SIR CHARLES**

Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** became the seventh player in Big South history with 10 career interceptions when he picked off his second pass of the year at Jacksonville in Week 3. He is tied for fifth-place all-time in League annals, and his 25-yard return against the Dolphins pushed his career interception return yardage to 143 -- which vaulted him to fifth in that category as well. Of his 10 career INTs, three have come against FBS opponents (2 at Hawai'i in 2010 and 1 at Florida State in Week 2).

**GOOD WILL HUNT-ING**

Charleston Southern DL **WILL HUNT** tied a Big South single-game record with 5.0 tackles-for-loss against Jacksonville in Week 3. Hunt is the fifth player to accomplish this feat and the first since VMI's **A.J. GROSS** did it against Coastal Carolina on Oct. 11, 2008.

**MARIO BROTHERS**

VMI TE **MARIO THOMPSON** became the first tight end in Big South history with 100 receiving yards in a game with his 114 at No. 6/9 Richmond in Week 3. His 70-yard touchdown pass play against the Spiders was the second-longest reception by a tight end in League annals -- just two yards shy of the record of 72 yards set by Charleston Southern's **CLAYTON COFFMAN** against North Greenville on Sept. 30, 2006.

**SUMMERS WIND**

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** set a Big South single-game record with 15 receptions in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh, breaking the mark of 14 he shared with Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**. Summers' 15 catches against the Mountain Hawks went for 205 yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in League history. It was his eighth career game with more than 100 yards receiving, which is second-most on the all-time list and two shy of former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE**'s career record of 10.

**TOTAL RECALL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** became the sixth player in Big South history with 6,000 career total offensive yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh. He now has 6,148 for his career and is 991 away from fifth-place in Conference history (7,139 - Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MacDOWALL** from 2008-10).

**AREA CODE 300**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** finished with a season-high 361 yards of offense in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh, his third game over 300 this season and the 11th of his career -- tying the all-time Conference record established by Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (2003-06). Brown's three 300-yard offensive games is already the fifth-most in a single-season in Big South history.

**NEW CONFERENCE TIEBREAKER NOW IN EFFECT**

The Big South Conference's football tiebreaker policy that determines the League's automatic qualifier to the FCS Playoffs has been changed and now includes road and home Conference wins as well as a point system based on complete schedule and wins. The changes, which are indicated in the chart to the right, replace the previous step iv., step v. and step vi. in breaking two-way ties and multiple ties, which was average points allowed in Conference games and Sagarin rating, respectively. The new tiebreaker policy is in effect and will be utilized if necessary.

**BLOCK OF AGES**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** is the first player in Big South history to block a punt and return it for a touchdown in consecutive games. The Conference's all-time leader now with eight career blocked kicks, Bethel blocked a Furman punt attempt and landed on it in the end zone in Week 4, one week after blocking a California punt and returning it 17 yards for a score against the Golden Bears. Bethel is the sixth player in League history with two punt return TDs in a single-season, and the first since 2008.

**THAT'S A FACT, JACK**

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** amassed 204 all-purpose yards in Week 4 against Lafayette with 98 rushing yards and 106 kickoff return yards. It was his fourth career 200-yard all-purpose game, and the kickoff return yardage pushed his career total to 1,072 -- eighth all-time in Big South history. He is now ninth in League annals in combined kick return yards (punt and kickoff) at 1,072.

**ALL-AMERICAN KICKER MATT BEVINS SUFFERS INJURY AGAINST JAMES MADISON**

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** suffered an injury against No. 13/14 James Madison in Week 3 and has missed the last two games. He is tied as the NCAA's active FCS leader in career field goals with a Big South-record 57 -- three away from becoming just the 11th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals. Bevins ranks second in Big South history with 283 career points kicking as well as third in overall scoring. He needs 15 points to break the Big South career kick scoring record of 297 points, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history, and he needs 15 PATs for second in Conference annals.

**FOGG ALERT**

Liberty KR **KEVIN FOGG** leads the Big South with a 31.3 kickoff return average, which ranks eighth in the nation. If Fogg can maintain his average for the remainder of the season, he would challenge the Big South single-season record of 32.0, which was set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2007. Bolden is the only player in Big South history to average more than 30.0 yards on kickoff returns for an entire season.

**GROUND PACKAGE**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is fifth all-time in Big South history with 23 career rushing touchdowns and needs four to tie former Gardner-Webb rusher **PATRICK HALL**, who had 27 from 2007-10, for fourth-place. Brown, who is the fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, has rushed 247 times for 1,161 yards (4.70 average) and 13 scores starting under center. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (2002-05) is just ahead of Brown on the all-time quarterback rushing list with 1,182 yards.

**SKIFF AND WESSON**

Stony Brook PK **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** became the school's all-time kick scoring leader in Week 4 after making three field goals and four extra-points against Lafayette. His career total of 164 points ranks seventh in Big South history, and he is two field goals shy of becoming the sixth kicker in League annals with 30 in a career.

**"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"**

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets host Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

**BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES**

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

**BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE**

Below is the Big South's tiebreaking procedure for two-way ties...

- i. Head-to-head competition.*
- ii. If a tie still exists, then the records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.*
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.*

- i. Composite records between the tying teams shall be evaluated to determine if one team has won more games against the other tying teams.*
- ii. In the event step "i" does not resolve the multiple ties or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.*
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.*
- iv. Road wins in Conference games.*
- v. Home wins in Conference games.*
- vi. Point system based on complete schedule and wins using the latest available Sagarin rankings as indicated below.*
