CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MALCOLM DIXON • QB • Sophomore
 Charleston Southern • Tifton, Ga.

Dixon rushed 27 times for 163 yards and a touch-down and finished with 247 yards of total offense against Jacksonville. His rushing attempts and yards were the second-most in a single-game by a Big South quarterback in League history, and he also threw for 84 yards and a score against the Dolphins. Dixon became the first Buccaneer to rush for more than 100 yards in a game since 2007, and he picked up seven of Charleston Southern's 19 first downs on the ground with runs of 40, 46, 8, 8, 15, 6 and 10 yards. With the Buccaneers trailing all game, Dixon's 3-yard touch-down run mid-way through the fourth quarter tied the score at 30-30 before the Dolphins pulled out the victory.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WILL HUNT • DL • R-Sophomore
 Charleston Southern • Greenville, S.C.

Hunt tied a Big South single-game record with 5.0 tackles-for-loss as part of a seven solo tackle afternoon at Jacksonville. He also recorded two sacks, forced two fumbles and had two quarterback hurries against the Dolphins. Hunt notched a sack-fumble in the second quarter, then later stuffed JU's running back for a one-yard loss on a 1st-and-Goal play at the 2-yard line (CSU intercepted a pass on the next play). Hunt posted another sack-fumble on the Jacksonville 6-yard line that set up the Buccaneers' first touch-down of the day late in the first half, while his two remaining solo stops went for no gain.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JUSTIN BETHEL • DB • Senior
 Presbyterian College • Blythewood, S.C.

Bethel increased his Big South record with his seventh career blocked kick when he deflected a punt and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter against California. It was the second-straight game that the Blue Hose blocked a punt or field goal and returned it for a score. Bethel added a 29-yard interception return for a touchdown to become the second defensive player in Big South history with two touchdowns in one game. He accounted for all of Presbyterian's scoring against the Golden Bears and extended PC's record of consecutive games not being shut out to 55.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Backus saw his first extended action of the season when he entered the second half at Georgia. He recorded six tackles (three solo, three assisted) to tie for the third-best tackle total against the Bulldogs. Of his six stops, two forced fourth down plays and another two ended drives.

HOME SWEET HOME

Charleston Southern finally makes its home debut this Saturday, as the Buccaneers host Norfolk State this weekend to be the final Big South member to play its 2011 home opener. The Big South is 3-3 in home openers this season, but could just as well be a perfect 6-0 as the average margin of defeat in three losses stands at 3.67 points. Charleston Southern looks to win its sixth-straight home opener this weekend.

AGENT P

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** needs seven receptions to break the Big South career record of 202, which is held by former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE** (2004-06). Perry has 196 and is the second among active players in career receptions in the Football Championship Subdivision, trailing Butler's **ZACH WATKINS** by one. Perry will have to wait a week to catch Price, as Gardner-Webb is idle until Oct. 1 at Samford.

GOOD WILL HUNT-ING

Charleston Southern DL **WILL HUNT** tied a Big South single-game record with 5.0 tackles-for-loss against Jacksonville this past Saturday. Hunt is the fifth player to accomplish this feat and the first since VMI's **A.J. GROSS** did it against Coastal Carolina on Oct. 11, 2008.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 66 games, the second-longest in Big South history and one away from tying the League-record of 67 games, which was set by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 55 games (37 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (36) and Stony Brook (30).

HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF

Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** is three receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions. Duran has 57 career catches, just two shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER**'s Conference record of 59 from 2007-10. Meanwhile, Duran is 183 yards away from becoming the first Big South tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards.

MARIO BROTHERS

VMI TE **MARIO THOMPSON** became the first tight end in Big South history with 100 receiving yards in a game with his 114 this past Saturday at No. 6/9 Richmond. His 70-yard touchdown pass play against the Spiders was the second-longest reception by a tight end in League annals -- just two yards shy of the record of 72 yards set by Charleston Southern's **CLAYTON COFFMAN** against North Greenville on Sept. 30, 2006.

SHIP SHAPE

Charleston Southern QB **MALCOLM DIXON** rushed 27 times for 163 yards this past Saturday at Jacksonville, the second-most rushing attempts and rushing yards in a single-game by a Big South quarterback in League history. Teammate **TEDDY ALLEN** added 125 rushing yards against the Dolphins, marking the first time since 1992 that Charleston Southern had two players rush for 100 yards in the same game. Meanwhile, the Bucs finished with 327 yards on the ground at Jacksonville, their most since 397 vs. West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005.

TOTAL RECALL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is 213 yards away from becoming the sixth player in Big South history with 6,000 career total offensive yards. He recorded his second game with more than 300 this past Saturday against No. 13/14 James Madison (333) -- his 10th career game over 300 and just one game away from tying the Big South mark of 11 that is held by Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (2003-06). Brown's career total of 5,787 ranks sixth on the Conference's all-time list, as he surpassed former Gardner-Webb QBs **DEVIN CAMPBELL** (5,485) and **STAN DOOLITTLE** (5,645) this past weekend.

NORTH BY NORTHWEST

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** recorded his second 100-yard rushing game in three weeks as he gained 153 against Brown this past Saturday. It was his sixth career 100-yard rushing game with the Seawolves, moving him into a tie with five other players for 10th in Big South history. His effort pushed him into the top spot in the Big South this season with 348 rushing yards, the same spot he held at the end of the 2010 campaign.

SOLO ARTIST

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** increased his Big South record for career blocked kicks to seven when he blocked a punt at California and returned it for a touchdown. Later in the game, Bethel returned an interception 29 yards for a score to become the second defensive player in Big South history with two touchdowns in a game. Former Gardner-Webb safety **MARIO WILLIAMS** was the first in 2004 (fumble and interception return TDs vs. Tennessee Tech). Bethel is tied for the League-lead with three INTs this season as he has recorded an interception in three-straight games -- the first Big South player with such a streak since Coastal Carolina's **JOSH NORMAN** in 2009. Meanwhile, Bethel is seventh in Conference history with 151 career solo tackles and he needs five to crack the top five and 17 for second-place.

SIR CHARLES

Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** became the seventh player in Big South history with 10 career interceptions when he picked off his second pass of the year this past Saturday at Jacksonville. He is now tied for fifth-place all-time in League annals, and his 25-yard return against the Dolphins pushed his career interception return yardage to 143 -- which vaulted him to fifth in that category as well. Of his 10 career INTs, three have come against FBS opponents (2 at Hawai'i in 2010 and 1 at Florida State in Week 2).

HIGH RATE OF RETURN

Stony Brook's **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (966) and Coastal Carolina's **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** (919) are approaching 1,000 combined kick return yards in their careers. The current list features 12 players.

300-TACKLE CLUB ACCEPTING NEW MEMBERS

VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS** is 12 tackles away from becoming the ninth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. He is the League's active leading-tackler with 288 career stops, ahead of teammate **BYRON ALLEN** (243). Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON** saw his first action of the season this past Saturday at Wake Forest and recorded four tackles against the Demon Deacons to push his career total to 225. Patterson is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Big South's 300-tackle list.

HE LIKELY REACHED THE BAY BRIDGE

Presbyterian College punter **PATRICK MORGANO**'s nine punts at California went for a Big South single-game record 465 yards -- an average of 51.7 yards which is the second-highest single-game punting average in Conference history. Morgano had five 50-yard punts against the Golden Bears, including a long of 63, plus a 57 and 58-yarder. The old record for punting yardage was 458 on 10 punts by Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** at Georgia Tech on Oct. 11, 2008.

DOUBLE DOWN

One week after taking over the Big South's active streak for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 13 games, Coastal Carolina was blanked at Georgia this past Saturday, meaning the Conference has another new leader in the category. Liberty takes over the Conference's active streak, as the Flames have scored 10+ points in each of their last 10 contests.

GROUND PACKAGE

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is fifth all-time in Big South history with 23 career rushing touchdowns and needs four to tie former Gardner-Webb rusher **PATRICK HALL**, who had 27 from 2007-10, for fourth-place. Brown, who is the fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, has rushed 226 times for 1,097 yards (4.85 average) and 13 scores starting under center. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (2002-05) is ahead of Brown on the all-time quarterback rushing list with 1,182 yards.

BEVINS SUFFERS INJURY AGAINST JAMES MADISON

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** suffered an injury against No. 13/14 James Madison and will be evaluated this week. He missed two field goal attempts against the Dukes but remains the NCAA's active FCS leader in career field goals with a Big South-record 57 -- three away from becoming just the 11th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals. Bevins ranks second in Big South history with 283 career points kicking as well as third in overall scoring. He needs 15 points to break the Big South career kick scoring record of 297 points, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history, and he needs 15 PATs for second in Conference annals.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He currently stands at 1,593 career rushing yards, 4,194 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

CATCHING UP

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is tied for third in Big South history with 21 career touchdown receptions. Former Gardner-Webb WR **WILLIAM ANDREWS, JR.** had 21 TD grabs from 2002-03. Summers is currently 10th in League history with 135 career catches and needs three receptions for the ninth spot. He is nine yards away from becoming the eighth receiver in League annals with 1,900 career receiving yards.

HOME EQUITY

Stony Brook is just the third team in Big South football history to play four consecutive home games in a single-season, joining the 2005 Liberty Flames and 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Liberty went 0-4 during its streak, while the Buccaneers were 4-0 during their four-game home stand. The Seawolves are 0-1 on thus far. Stay tuned.

AIR MAIL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season in 2010, has now surpassed that yardage total in 14 consecutive games after passing for 298 yards this past Saturday against No. 13/14 James Madison. In just 15 career starts at quarterback, Brown has thrown for more than 200 yards in each contest, is 311-of-477 passing (=65.2 percent) for 3,984 yards and 29 touchdowns, in addition to being 10-5.

EXPRESS DELIVERY

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is tied for seventh in Big South history with 32 career touchdown passes and is eight scoring strikes away from becoming the sixth player with 40. Brown has thrown a TD pass in each of the first three games this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at six.

KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK

Charleston Southern DB **CHRIS KUZDALE** is among the national nominees for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Teams -- college football's preeminent community service award. Kuzdale is the lone representative from the Big South Conference, and is the League's third-ever nominee. Kuzdale's former teammate **JORDAN LANCASTER** was named to the team last year -- the only Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

FB-YES

For the second consecutive year, the Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents this season. In 2010, the Conference picked up its first-ever wins against FBS members, **and did so on the same day** when Gardner-Webb and Liberty defeated MAC teams on Sept. 11. The Big South was the only FCS AQ Conference with two FBS wins in 2010.

BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets face Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.
