### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Senior**  
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown was responsible for four touchdowns in the Flames' victory over No. 20 Coastal Carolina this past weekend, as he rushed for two scores and threw two TDs. He totaled 279 yards of offense after rushing 13 times for 61 yards (4.7 average) and going 13-of-17 passing for 218 yards and no interceptions to finish with a 223.01 passing efficiency. Brown opened the game's scoring with a 5-yard run and added a 1-yard dash to give Liberty a 21-0 first quarter lead. He completed passes to eight different receivers, including a 32-yard scoring strike to Peter Gagliardi and a 50-yard touchdown pass to Pat Kelly. Brown converted four third downs (two rushes and two pass completions) and two fourth down plays himself, including his 1-yard scoring run on 4th-and-Goal.

### CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**JUSTIN BETHEL • DB • Senior**  
Presbyterian College • Blythewood, S.C.

Bethel had a team-high 12 total tackles (seven solo, five assisted), one forced fumble, one pass break-up and a blocked field goal in leading the Blue Hose to a win over Gardner-Webb. His forced fumble in the first quarter led to PC's third touchdown and a commanding 21-0 lead early in the second stanza. Bethel then kept GWU off the scoreboard on the ensuing drive with his block of a 26-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter -- his third blocked kick this season to extend his Big South career record to nine.

**BYRON ALLEN • LB • R-Senior**  
VMI • Massaponax, Va.

Allen batted down four passes near the line of scrimmage in Saturday's win against Charleston Southern. One of the break-ups was during a third quarter goal-line stand on a 3rd-and-Goal play at the VMI 1. On the next play, Allen assisted on a tackle for no gain to keep the Buccaneers out of the end zone and give the ball back to the Keydets. He broke up another two passes on second down plays and one on third down, and finished with five tackles, including one for loss of four yards.

After Saint Anselm scored on its first possession of the second half, Jackolski returned the ensuing kick-off 90 yards for a touchdown, becoming just the third player in Big South history with two kickoff return touchdowns of 90 yards-or-longer.

Rice scored his first two career touchdowns this past Saturday against No. 20 Coastal Carolina, scoring on a pair of 1-yard rushing plays. His first rushing TD of the game gave the Flames a 35-0 advantage midway through the second quarter. Rice later tallied his second score from a yard out to convert a 3rd-and-Goal situation.

**OPENING ON A POSITIVE NOTE**

Liberty is 2-0 in Big South play for the fifth consecutive season, becoming the first program in League history to open Conference action 2-0 five-straight years. The Flames are looking for their fifth-straight 3-0 start this weekend. Meanwhile, Stony Brook is 1-0 for the third-straight year and is looking to start 2-0 for the third consecutive season.

**UNCHARTERED WATERS**

Big South football charter member Gardner-Webb finds itself 0-2 in Conference play for the first time ever.

**OH, THERE YOU ARE PERRY**

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** is the Big South's all-time receptions leader with 210 career catches. He remains second among active players in career receptions in the Football Championship Subdivision, trailing Butler's **ZACH WATKINS**, who has 228. Perry, who broke the League's receptions record in Week 6 against Liberty, needs 204 receiving yards to break the Big South career record in that category. The current record is 2,720 yards set by former Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** from 2004-07.

**BIG SOUTH TO FACE NATION'S NUMBER 1 TEAM FOR FOURTH TIME IN CONFERENCE HISTORY**

This weekend the Big South will play the current No. 1-ranked FCS team for the fourth time in the Conference's 10-year football history, as Presbyterian College travels to No. 1 Georgia Southern for a 2:00pm meeting with the Eagles. The last Big South team to play the No. 1 team in the nation was VMI in 2009 (Richmond). The Big South is 1-2 all-time when playing the nation's top-ranked FCS team, with Coastal Carolina owning the lone victory with its 31-27 triumph over James Madison on Sept. 10, 2005. The Conference's two losses have been by an average of 13.5 points

**MONSIEURS 3,000**

This past weekend, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** and Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** became the ninth and 10th Big South players, respectively, to surpass 3,000 career all-purpose yards. Jackolski, who eclipsed the milestone a few hours after Brown, is ninth in Big South history with 3,127 career all-purpose yards and 35 away from moving into eighth-place. Brown stands in 10th with 3,060. Meanwhile, Jackolski's per game average of 193.5 yards is pacing way ahead of the Big South single-season record of 179.5 (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2007), and he is on track to finish with 2,129 all-purpose yards, which would break Maypray's Big South single-season record of 1,975 set in 2007.

**BIG SOUTH INFERNO**

Liberty is in the midst of a Big South-record 13-game home Conference win streak. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 617 points (47.5 points per game), has scored more than 30 points in each contest, and has held its League brethren to 223 points (17.2). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

**FROM SEA TO SHINING SEA**

Stony Brook rushed for 404 yards this past Saturday against Saint Anselm en route to 679 yards of total offense, the second-highest single-game offensive output in Conference history. Stony Brook averaged 10.13 yards per play against the Hawks, the second time a Big South squad averaged at least 10.0 yards in a contest. The Seawolves finished 16 yards short of the League's single-game record of 695 (set by Charleston Southern vs. West Virginia Wesleyan in 2005) and its per play average trailed VMI's record 10.45 average vs. Presbyterian in 2008.

**BIG SOUTH'S TV PACKAGE CONTINUES THIS WEEKEND**

The Big South's television package continues this weekend with one game on the slate, as Gardner-Webb at Coastal Carolina will be televised live on MASN at 7:00pm. **TOM WERME** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action from Conway.

**HEY NORM!**

Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN** became the Big South's all-time leader in career pass break-ups this past Saturday at Liberty. He broke up two passes against the Flames to push his career total to 32 -- besting the old mark of 31 set by former Chanticleers safety **QUINTON TEAL** (2003-06). Norman remains second to Teal in Conference annals with 44 passes defensed and 12 interceptions, as Teal holds the all-time marks of 48 PD and 17 INT.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty holds the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 70, breaking the old mark of 67 that was established by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 58 games (40 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (39), Stony Brook (33) and VMI (15).

**30 BROCK**

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown this past Saturday against Saint Anselm, becoming just the third player in Big South history with two 90-yard-plus kickoff returns. Jackolski joins Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** as the only players with two career kickoff returns of at least 90 yards. In addition, Jackolski is now one of four players in League annals with two career kickoff returns for touchdowns.

**BEVINS TIES BIG SOUTH CAREER SCORING RECORD**

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** made 9-of-9 PATs this past weekend against Coastal Carolina to push his career scoring total to 297 points -- tying the all-time Big South record for career points. Bevins has matched the mark first set by former Chanticleer kicker **JOSH HOKE** from 2003-06. Meanwhile, Bevins is second among active FCS kickers in career field goals with a Big South-record 57 -- three away from becoming just the 11th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals. Bevins, whose 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history, needs two PATs for 128 in his career and sole possession of second in Conference annals.

**HOME EQUITY**

Stony Brook, which is just the third team in Big South football history to play four consecutive home games in a single-season, completed its home stand with a 3-1 record. The Seawolves joined the 2005 Liberty Flames and 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers as the only programs with four-straight home games in one season. Liberty went 0-4 during its streak, while the Buccaneers were 4-0 during their four-game home stand.

**DOUBLED UP**

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 30. Stony Brook has the next-longest active streak at 17 games, followed by Coastal Carolina at 13. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 42 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 39 of its League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (14 games).

**MORE CONFERENCE STREAKS**

Stony Brook has won its last eight home Conference games -- tied for the second-longest streak in Big South history (Liberty holds the mark with its current streak of 13 consecutive home League wins). The Flames have now scored 30 points in each of their last 12 Big South contests -- tying their own Big South mark originally accomplished from Nov. 11, 2006 - Oct. 17, 2009.

**LITTLE BIG MAN**

Gardner-Webb RB **KENNY LITTLE** is second in the Big South with 594 rushing yards, and is 23 rushing yards away from surpassing the team's leading individual rushing total from all of last year -- 616 by **PATRICK HALL**.

**TOTAL RECALL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who has a Big South-record 12 career 300-total offense games, is sixth in League history with 6,793 career yards of total offense. He needs 207 yards of offense to become the sixth player with 7,000, and is 346 away from fifth-place in Conference history (7,139 - Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MacDOWALL** from 2008-10). Brown's four 300-yard offensive games this year is already the fourth-most in a single-season in Big South history.

**WELCOME TO THE CLUB**

VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS**, who became the ninth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles in Week 6, is currently at 304 and is five stops away from jumping into sixth-place on the all-time list. Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON** is 38 tackles shy of 300 in his career, and he is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Big South's 300-tackle list. Meanwhile, Gross' teammate **BYRON ALLEN** sits at 251.

**TEETER-TOTER**

Liberty's 63-27 victory over Coastal Carolina this past Saturday knocked the Chanticleers out of the FCS Coaches Top 25 poll, and moved the Flames up to No. 29 in the coaches ranking. Liberty moved up to No. 28 in the *Sports Network*/Fathead.com Top 25 poll this week as well. Coastal Carolina was ranked No. 20 last week, and had appeared in the national rankings for the first time since 2007. With Liberty ranked the first four weeks of the 2011 campaign, this was just the second time in Conference history that two Big South football teams were ranked in the Top 25 in the same season.

**SOLO ARTISTS**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** is second in Big South history with 173 career solo tackles, and is 22 solo stops away from tying the Conference's career record of 195 established by Charleston Southern LB **JADA ROSS** from 2004-07. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb LB **MARTY PATTERSON** moved into the career Top 10 this past weekend and is now tied for eighth in League history with 145 career solo tackles.

**4x1,000-YARD RELAY TEAM**

Liberty is close to having four active players with 1,000 career receiving yards, as WR **PAT KELLY** is 50 yards away from the milestone. Once Kelly reaches the mark, he will join **CHRIS SUMMERS** (2,312), **B.J. HAYES** (1,079) and **MIKE BROWN** (1,054) in the career 1,000-yard receiving club.

**RUSHING UPDATE**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** is 203 rushing yards away from entering the Big South's all-time Top 10 in the category, and is 208 rushing yards shy of becoming the 10th player in League history with 2,000 career rushing yards. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is third in Big South history with 24 career touchdown receptions, and is six TD grabs shy of becoming the third player with 30. Summers is currently fifth in League history with 164 career catches and needs three receptions for the fourth spot. He became the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4 (now fifth at 2,312), and is 118 yards from moving into fourth all-time. Since the start of the 2010 season, Summers has 116 receptions, 1,695 yards and 20 touchdowns in 17 games played.

**BLOCK OF AGES**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** -- the only player in Big South history to block a punt and return it for a touchdown in consecutive games, blocked his third kick of the season this past Saturday against Gardner-Webb. He has blocked two punts and one field goal this year, and needs one more blocked kick to tie the Big South single-season record of four. The Conference's all-time leader now with nine career blocked kicks, Bethel blocked a Furman punt attempt and landed on it in the end zone in Week 4, one week after blocking a California punt and returning it 17 yards for a score against the Golden Bears.

**AIR MAIL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season in 2010, has surpassed that yardage total in 17 consecutive games played after passing for 218 yards this past weekend against Coastal Carolina. In just 18 career starts at quarterback, Brown has thrown for more than 200 yards in each contest, is 371-of-562 passing (=66.0 percent) for 4,862 yards and 36 touchdowns, in addition to being 12-6.

**EXPRESS DELIVERY**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is seventh in Big South history with 39 career touchdown passes and is one scoring strike away from becoming the sixth player with 40. Brown has thrown a TD pass in each of his six games this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at nine. The last Big South QB with nine-straight games with a TD pass was Liberty's **BROCK SMITH**, who threw a touchdown pass in the final seven games of the 2007 season and the first two games in 2008. Meanwhile, Brown also owns a streak of five-straight games with at least two touchdown passes, the best in the Big South since Stony Brook QB **MICHAEL COULTER** had six consecutive multi-TD pass games during the 2009 season.

**MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE**

Coastal Carolina sophomore **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the third player in Big South history with 40 career punt returns (41), and he is three away from becoming the all-time leader in the category. Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** (2003-07) holds the record of 43. Mastromatteo is fourth in League annals with 314 career punt return yards, 211 yards away from Jackson's Big South mark of 525. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is fifth in Big South history with 77 combined kick returns in his brief career (36 KR, 41 PR). Former Gardner-Webb WR **TYSON PETTY** (2007-10) is fourth with 89.

**SIX GAMES IN AND...**

Five of the first six Big South Conference games this season have been decided by double figures, including three by at least 24 points, and the average winning margin currently sits at 21.3 points -- the highest in League history. Last year, the 21 Conference football games were decided by 20.8 points.

**ON TOP OF LIBERTY MOUNTAIN**

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (37.4) and scoring defense (19.1), a feat they accomplished in 2007, 2009 and 2010. The Flames are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead in scoring offense three consecutive seasons, while their defensive prowess has them on track to have the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented sixth-straight campaign.

**CRUZZIN ON A SATURDAY EVENING**

Stony Brook RB **JeVAHN CRUZ** rushed 10 times for 169 yards and two touchdowns this past Saturday against Saint Anselm. His 16.9 average yards per rush is the second-highest single-game average in Big South history, based on a minimum of 10 rushing attempts. The record is 18.77 yards per rush, set by Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** against VMI on Oct. 27, 2007 when Tolbert rushed 13 times for 244 yards against the Keydets.

**BYRD IS THE WORD**

Presbyterian College RB **LANCE BYRD** scored three rushing touchdowns this past Saturday against Gardner-Webb. It was the first time since the Blue Hose joined the Big South in 2008 that they had a player with three rushing scores in a game.

**CAGED BIRD**

Coastal Carolina's streak of not allowing a punt return for a touchdown in a Conference game ended at 37 games this past weekend as Liberty scored on a blocked punt return against the Chanticleers.

**GROUND PACKAGE**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is fifth all-time in Big South history with 26 career rushing touchdowns and needs one to tie former Gardner-Webb rusher **PATRICK HALL**, who had 27 from 2007-10, for fourth-place. Brown's six rushing touchdowns this season are the fifth-most by a Big South quarterback in a single-season, and three away from matching his total from last year. The fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, Brown has rushed 265 times for 1,225 yards (4.62 average) and 16 scores starting under center. He is the Big South's fourth-leading all-time rusher among quarterbacks, and he is three rushing touchdowns away from tying the Conference's all-time mark for a QB (19 - Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS**, 2002-05).

**HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF**

Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** remains two receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions. Duran has 58 career catches, just one shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER**'s Conference record of 59 from 2007-10. Meanwhile, Duran is 180 yards away from becoming the first Big South tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards.

**YOU COMPLETE ME**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the Big South's all-time career leader for completion percentage at 65.6 percent (392-of-598). He recorded his fourth career 300-yard passing game in Week 6 at Gardner-Webb, the third-most in League history. Brown also threw three touchdown passes against the Runnin' Bulldogs, marking the fifth time in his career he has achieved the feat -- the fourth-most 3-TD pass games in Conference annals.

**TIGHT BEGINNING**

Liberty TE **TOMMY SHAVER** became the second tight end in Big South history -- and second this season -- with 100 receiving yards in a game with his 110 in Week 6 at Gardner-Webb. VMI TE **MARIO THOMPSON** was the first to achieve this feat with his 114 receiving yards at No. 6/9 Richmond in Week 3.

**SKIFF AND WESSON**

Stony Brook PK **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** became the school's all-time kick scoring leader in Week 4 after making three field goals and four extra-points against Lafayette. His career total of 174 points kicking rank seventh in Big South history, and he is two field goals shy of becoming the sixth kicker in League annals with 30 in a career.

**TAKING ATTENDANCE**

Through 21 home dates, the Big South's seven football playing members are averaging a combined 7,903 fans per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference's record attendance average of 7,488 in 2007. Liberty leads the Big South with its 17,394 per game average, and Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Presbyterian College, Stony Brook and VMI are all posting average attendance gains over last season. The Conference needs to draw 95,042 during its remaining 16 home dates (=5,940 average) to break the all-time combined total home attendance record of 260,998 that was established in 2008.

**ROLL CALL**

The attendance of 19,111 for this past Saturday's Coastal Carolina at Liberty game was the largest home crowd for a Big South game in League history. The previous best was 18,587 for the Flames' home game against Charleston Southern on Oct. 9, 2010.

**NEW CONFERENCE TIEBREAKER**

The Big South Conference's football tiebreaker policy that determines the League's automatic qualifier to the FCS Playoffs has been changed and now includes road and home Conference wins as well as a point system based on complete schedule and wins. The changes, which are indicated in the chart to the right, replace the previous step iv., step v. and step vi. in breaking two-way ties and multiple ties, which were average points allowed in Conference games and Sagarin rating, respectively. The new tiebreaker policy is in effect and will be utilized if necessary.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He currently stands at 1,721 career rushing yards, 5,072 career passing yards and 1,054 career receiving yards.

**THE HILLS ARE ALIVE**

Coastal Carolina QB **ARAMIS HILLARY** had 245 passing yards and rushed for another 114 in Week 6 against VMI, becoming the fourth different Big South player in League history with 200 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game. The last Coastal Carolina QB to achieve this feat was **TYLER THIGPEN**, who threw for 306 yards and rushed for 119 at Gardner-Webb on Nov. 11, 2006.

**SUMMERS WIND**

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** set a Big South single-game record with 15 receptions in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh, breaking the mark of 14 he shared with Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**. Summers' 15 catches against the Mountain Hawks went for 205 yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in League history. Summers has two 100-yard receiving games this season and nine in his career -- second-most on the Big South all-time list and one shy of tying former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE**'s career record of 10.

**"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"**

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets host Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

**BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES**

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

**THE BUCK STOPS HERE**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** was added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Oct. 4, the Big South's first official candidate for the FCS national defensive player of the year since 2009 and the fifth overall. A national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the Payton and Buchanan awards after the regular season, beginning Nov. 21.

**BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE**

- ii. In the event step "i" does not resolve the multiple ties or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.*
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.*
- iv. Road wins in Conference games.*
- v. Home wins in Conference games.*
- vi. Point system based on complete schedule and wins using the latest available Sagarin rankings as indicated below.*

\* Charleston Southern meets Liberty for the 19th time on Saturday. The Flames lead the series, 16-2.

\* The Buccaneers last defeated Liberty in 2005, a 31-30 home win on Nov. 12, marking their only win over the Flames as Big South members.

\* Charleston Southern has not scored in the first quarter in its last seven games, dating back to last season.

\* Conversely, the Bucs have scored 75 percent of their points (60 of 80) in the second half this season.

\* The Buccaneers are 0-6 for the first time since 1994 and just the second time in program history. Their current seven-game overall skid is their longest since 2003 when they lost eight-straight.

\* QB **MALCOLM DIXON** threw for a career-high 205 yards this past Saturday at VMI. He has amassed at least 247 yards of total offense in three of his last four games.

\* CSU has had four non-quarterback pass attempts this season, the most in a season since 2007.
