In his first career start at Stony Brook, Essington accounted for five of Stony Brook's six touchdowns in the Seawolves' 42-24 Big South-opening win over Presbyterian College. He was 17-of-27 passing for 292 yards and four touchdowns, and also ran for a score from 18 yards out. Essington connected on nine of his first 10 passes of the game, and threw touchdowns of 44, 40, 22 and 23 yards to keep Stony Brook ahead the entire contest. He finished the day with a passing efficiency rating of 202.70, and has been named National Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards. Essington was making his first start in place of injured starter Michael Coulter.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JOSH NORMAN • CB • Senior
Coastal Carolina • Greenwood, S.C.

Norman posted seven total tackles -- all solo, to lead the Chanticleer defense against VMI. He also recorded an interception and broke-up an additional three passes. With the Keydets on the Coastal 34-yard line, Norman deflected a pass on first down, and on the same drive, broke up a pass in the end zone to force a turnover on downs. His third pass break-up forced a punt, and his interception late in the second quarter led to another Coastal Carolina touchdown before halftime.

Jackolski amassed 180 of his 319 all-purpose yards on kick returns against Presbyterian College, as he returned his first-ever punt for Stony Brook 44 yards, and gained 136 yards on four kickoff returns. He averaged 36.0 yards on his five combined returns to give the Seawolves great field possession, and his 37-yard kickoff return and 44-yard punt return led to two touchdowns. Jackolski, who also had a 60-yard kickoff return against the Blue Hose, finished with the fourth-most all-purpose yards in a single-game in Big South history.

Rice finished as Liberty's leading rusher against Gardner-Webb, rushing nine times for a career-high 52 yards in the victory over the Runnin' Bulldogs. He averaged 5.8 yards per rush, had a long rush of 22 yards and picked up three first downs. Rice also recorded a tackle on special teams, his fourth stop of the season.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF...

Liberty, Coastal Carolina and Stony Brook -- last season's co-champions, opened their respective Conference seasons with wins this past Saturday to all start 1-0 in Big South play. This coming weekend, the Flames will look to start 2-0 in the Big South for the fifth consecutive time, which would extend their League record. Coastal Carolina is looking for its first 2-0 Big South start since 2006. Stony Brook will try to improve to 2-0 in two weeks when the Seawolves resume Conference action.

SOMETHING'S GOT TO GIVE

The Big South will have only one team start 2-0 after this weekend, as Liberty and Coastal Carolina meet this Saturday in Lynchburg. The winner of the previous seven Coastal Carolina-Liberty matchups has won or shared the Big South football Championship. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the 2010 title. Will the trend continue in 2011?

OH, THERE YOU ARE PERRY

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** became the Big South's all-time receptions leader this past weekend when he caught his 203rd career pass during the fourth quarter against Liberty. Perry broke the old mark of 202 that was set by former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE** from 2004-06. Perry is second among active players in career recpetions in the Football Championship Subdivision, trailing Butler's **ZACH WATKINS**, who has 221.

BIG SOUTH INFERNO

Liberty puts its Big South-record 12-game home Conference win streak on the line this weekend when the Flames host Coastal Carolina Saturday at 3:30pm. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 554 points (46.2 points per game), has scored more than 30 points in each contest, and has held its League brethren to 196 points (16.3). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

A LOOK BACK AT WEEK ONE OF CONFERENCE ACTION

Coastal Carolina extended the longest active win streak in Big South games to five with its 34-10 win over VMI. Stony Brook has now won its last eight home Conference games -- tied for the second-longest streak in Big South history (Liberty holds the mark with its current streak of 12 consecutive home League wins). The Flames have now scored 30 points in each of their last 11 Big South contests.

SECOND-AND-ONE

Saturday will be the second and final week featuring Conference openers, as Charleston Southern begins its Big South slate with a trip to VMI. The Buccaneers are 3-6 all-time in their Big South openers, and will open against the Keydets for the fifth time. Charleston Southern is opening Conference action on the road for the third-straight season and the sixth time overall, but is 0-5 in the such games.

BIG SOUTH'S TV PACKAGE CONTINUES THIS WEEKEND

The Big South's television package continues this weekend with two games on the slate. Charleston Southern at VMI will open Saturday's TV coverage, as the 1:30pm game will be carried live exclusively on ESPN3.com. **TOM WERME** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action from Lexington. At 2:00pm, WMYA-TV 40 in Greenville/Spartanburg/Asheville will air live the Gardner-Webb at Presbyterian College game, with **JACK CONNORS** (play-by-play), **JASON PATTERSON** (analyst) and **TIFFANY ERVIN** (sideline) on the call.

COASTAL CAROLINA MOVES UP IN NATIONAL RANKINGS

Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 20 in the nation in this week's FCS Coaches poll, up four spots from last week's No. 24 position. It is Coastal's highest ranking since being ranked No. 20 in the 2007 preseason poll, which was the last time the Chanticleers were nationally-ranked before this season. With Liberty ranked the first four weeks of the 2011 season, this marks just the second time in Conference history that two Big South football teams were ranked in the Top 25 in the same season.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty holds the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 69, breaking the old mark of 67 that was established by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 57 games (39 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (38) and Stony Brook (32).

THE BUCK STOPS HERE

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** was added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List last week, the Big South's first official candidate for the FCS national defensive player of the year since 2009 and the fifth overall.

DOUBLED UP

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 29. Stony Brook has the next-longest active streak at 17 games, followed by Coastal Carolina at 12. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 41 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 38 of their League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (13 games).

LITTLE BIG MAN

Gardner-Webb RB **KENNY LITTLE** is the first Gardner-Webb player to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since **PATRICK HALL** did it last season on Oct. 16 and 23. Little has three 100-yard rushing games this season and is second in the Big South with 510 rushing yards. He is 107 rushing yards away from surpassing the team's leading individual rushing total from all of last year (Hall with 616).

AREA CODE 300

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** finished with a season-high 366 yards of offense this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb, his fourth game over 300 this season and the 12th of his career -- breaking the all-time Conference record of 11 established by Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (2003-06). Brown's four 300-yard offensive games is already the fourth-most in a single-season in Big South history.

TOTAL RECALL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who became the sixth player in Big South history with 6,000 career total offensive yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4, is sixth all-time with 6,514 yards for his career. He is 625 away from fifth-place in Conference history (7,139 - Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MACDOWALL** from 2008-10).

WELCOME TO THE CLUB

VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS** became the ninth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he reached the milestone this past weekend at Coastal Carolina. Gross is currently at 300, and could have additional players join him in the elite group by season's end. Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON**, who missed the first two games this season due to injury, has 33 stops after three contests to push his career total to 254. He is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldogs on the Big South's 300-tackle list. Gross' teammate **BYRON ALLEN** sits at 246.

BROCK OF AGES

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** amassed 319 all-purpose yards this past weekend against Presbyterian College, the fourth-most single-game all-purpose yard total in Big South history. Jackolski is just the third Big South player with a 300-yard all-purpose game, joining VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** (2006-09) and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (2007-10), who had two each. Jackolski need 69 yards to become just the ninth player in Conference annals with 3,000 career all-purpose yards. His per game average of 193.0 yards is pacing way ahead of the Big South single-season record of 179.5 (Maypray in 2007).

4x1,000-YARD RELAY TEAM

Liberty is close to having four active players with 1,000 career receiving yards, as WR **PAT KELLY** is 114 yards away from the milestone. Once Kelly reaches the mark, he will join **CHRIS SUMMERS** (2,229), **B.J. HAYES** (1,082) and **MIKE BROWN** (1,049) in the career 1,000-yard receiving club.

SOLO ARTIST

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** is third in Big South history with 166 career solo tackles, and needs two to take over second-place, which is currently held by former Gardner-Webb safety **MARIO WILLIAMS**, who had 167 solo stops from 2002-04. Charleston Southern's **JADA ROSS** (2004-07) is the Big South record holder for career solo tackles with 195. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb LB **MARTY PATTERSON** (137) needs four solo tackles to move into the League's all-time Top 10.

HOME EQUITY

Stony Brook is just the third team in Big South football history to play four consecutive home games in a single-season, joining the 2005 Liberty Flames and 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Liberty went 0-4 during its streak, while the Buccaneers were 4-0 during their four-game home stand. The Seawolves are 2-1 on thus far.

THIS HILLS ARE ALIVE

Coastal Carolina QB **ARAMIS HILLARY** had 245 passing yards and rushed for another 114 against VMI this past weekend, becoming the fourth different Big South player in League history with 200 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game. The last Coastal Carolina QB to achieve this feat was **TYLER THIGPEN**, who threw for 306 yards and rushed for 119 at Gardner-Webb on Nov. 11, 2006.

HEY NORM!

Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN** is second in Big South history with 42 passes defended (12 INT, 30 PBU). He is second all-time in interceptions, and his 30 pass break-ups are tied with Gardner-Webb's **MARIO WILLIAMS** (2002-04) for second in League annals. Former Chanticleers safety **QUINTON TEAL** (2003-06) is the all-time leader in all three categories -- 48 PD, 17 INT, 31 PBU.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He currently stands at 1,660 career rushing yards, 4,854 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

CATCHING UP

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is third in Big South history with 24 career touchdown receptions, and is six TD grabs shy of becoming the third player with 30. Summers is currently sixth in League history with 159 career catches and needs two receptions for the fifth spot. He became the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4 (now fifth at 2,229), and is 148 yards from moving into fourth all-time. Since the start of the 2010 season, Summers has 111 receptions, 1,612 yards and 20 touchdowns in 16 games played.

AIR MAIL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season in 2010, has surpassed that yardage total in 16 consecutive games after passing for a career-high 363 yards this past weekend at Gardner-Webb. In just 17 career starts at quarterback, Brown has thrown for more than 200 yards in each contest, is 358-of-545 passing (=65.7 percent) for 4,644 yards and 34 touchdowns, in addition to being 11-6.

TIGHT BEGINNING

Liberty TE **TOMMY SHAVER** became the second tight end in Big South history -- and second this season -- with 100 receiving yards in a game with his 110 at Gardner-Webb this past Saturday. VMI TE **MARIO THOMPSON** was the first to achieve this feat with his 114 receiving yards at No. 6/9 Richmond in Week 3. His 70-yard touchdown pass play against the Spiders was the second-longest reception by a tight end in League annals -- just two yards shy of the record of 72 yards set by Charleston Southern's **CLAYTON COFFMAN** against North Greenville on Sept. 30, 2006. Meanwhile, Shaver has 12 receptions this season, matching his total for the first three years of his career.

HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF

Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** remains two receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions. Duran has 58 career catches, just one shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER**'s Conference record of 59 from 2007-10. Meanwhile, Duran is 180 yards away from becoming the first Big South tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards.

BIG SIRs

Liberty RB **SIRCHAUNCEY HOLLOWAY**'s career-high four rushing touchdowns in Week 5 against Kentucky Wesleyan pushed his career total to 21 -- tied for ninth in Big South history with former Coastal Carolina FB **MIKE TOLBERT** (2004-07). Holloway is the fourth Liberty player with at least 20 rushing touchdowns on the Conference's all-time career list.

SECOND FIDDLE?

Two Big South teams have scored at least 60 percent of their points this season in the second half. Charleston Southern has scored 68.3 percent of its points in the last 30 minutes (43 of 63), while VMI has scored 46 of its 70 points in the second half (=65.7 percent), including 43 points in the final 15 minutes of the game.

FUN FACT

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return for a touchdown in a Conference game at 37 games.

RHODES CONSTRUCTION

Gardner-Webb kickoff/punt returner **RICKY RHODES** is fifth in the nation in punt return average at 17.5, which is just off the Big South single-season record of 18.1 set by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2008. Gardner-Webb has not had a player average 10.0 yards per punt return (based on 1.2 returns per game) since 2005 when **KORY ALSTON** averaged 16.5 on his punt returns.

EXPRESS DELIVERY

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is seventh in Big South history with 37 career touchdown passes and is three scoring strikes away from becoming the sixth player with 40. Brown has thrown a TD pass in each of his five games this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at eight. The last Big South QB with eight-straight games with a TD pass was Presbyterian College QB **BRANDON MILEY**, who threw a touchdown pass in the final seven games of 2008 as well as the 2009 season opener.

MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE

Coastal Carolina sophomore **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the third player in Big South history with 40 career punt returns, and he is four away from becoming the all-time leader in the category. Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** (2003-07) holds the record of 43. Mastromatteo is sixth in League annals with 298 career punt return yards, 227 yards away from Jackson's Big South mark of 525. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is fifth in Big South history with 70 combined kick returns in his brief career (30 KR, 40 PR). Former Gardner-Webb WR **TYSON PETTY** (2007-10) is fourth with 89.

SIR CHARLES

Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** became the seventh player in Big South history with 10 career interceptions when he picked off his second pass of the year at Jacksonville in Week 3. He is tied for fifth-place all-time in League annals, and his 25-yard return against the Dolphins pushed his career interception return yardage to 143 -- which vaulted him to fifth in that category as well. Of his 10 career INTs, three have come against FBS opponents (2 at Hawai'i in 2010 and 1 at Florida State in Week 2).

SUMMERS WIND

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** set a Big South single-game record with 15 receptions in Week 4 at No. 15/16 Lehigh, breaking the mark of 14 he shared with Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**. Summers' 15 catches against the Mountain Hawks went for 205 yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in League history. Summers has two 100-yard receiving games this season and nine in his career -- second-most on the Big South all-time list and one shy of tying former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE**'s career record of 10.

BLOCK OF AGES

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** is the first player in Big South history to block a punt and return it for a touchdown in consecutive games. The Conference's all-time leader now with eight career blocked kicks, Bethel blocked a Furman punt attempt and landed on it in the end zone in Week 4, one week after blocking a California punt and returning it 17 yards for a score against the Golden Bears. Bethel is the sixth player in League history with two punt return TDs in a single-season, and the first since 2008.

SKIFF AND WESSON

Stony Brook PK **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** became the school's all-time kick scoring leader in Week 4 after making three field goals and four extra-points against Lafayette. His career total of 170 points ranks seventh in Big South history, and he is two field goals shy of becoming the sixth kicker in League annals with 30 in a career.

BEACH PARTY

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 30 points in five consecutive Conference games, a first for the Chanticleer program. Interestingly enough, it is the third-longest streak in Big South history behind Liberty's current streak of 11 and the Flames' all-time mark of 12. Coastal's previous best streak was four-straight League games with 30 points, which occurred Oct. 23, 2004 - Oct. 15, 2005.

YOU COMPLETE ME

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the Big South's all-time career leader for completion percentage at 65.2 percent (379-of-581). He recorded his fourth career 300-yard passing game this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb, the third-most in League history. Brown also threw three touchdown passes against the Runnin' Bulldogs, marking the fifth time in his career he has achieved the feat and the fourth-most 3-TD pass games in Conference annals.

NEW CONFERENCE TIEBREAKER NOW IN EFFECT

The Big South Conference's football tiebreaker policy that determines the League's automatic qualifier to the FCS Playoffs has been changed and now includes road and home Conference wins as well as a point system based on complete schedule and wins. The changes, which are indicated in the chart to the right, replace the previous step iv., step v. and step vi. in breaking two-way ties and multiple ties, which were average points allowed in Conference games and Sagarin rating, respectively. The new tiebreaker policy is in effect and will be utilized if necessary.

ALL-AMERICAN KICKER MATT BEVINS RETURNS TO ACTION

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** returned to action this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb after missing two games following an injury suffered against No. 13/14 James Madison in Week 3. He is the NCAA's second-active leader in career field goals in FCS with a Big South-record 57 -- three away from becoming just the 11th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals. Bevins ranks second in Big South history with 288 career points kicking as well as overall scoring. He needs 10 points to break the Big South career kick scoring record of 297 points, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history, and he needs 10 PATs for second in Conference annals.

FOGG ALERT

Liberty KR **KEVIN FOGG** leads the Big South with a 31.3 kickoff return average, which ranks fifth in the nation. If Fogg can maintain his average for the remainder of the season, he would challenge the Big South single-season record of 32.0, which was set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2007. Bolden is the only player in Big South history to average more than 30.0 yards on kickoff returns for an entire season.

GROUND PACKAGE

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is fifth all-time in Big South history with 24 career rushing touchdowns and needs three to tie former Gardner-Webb rusher **PATRICK HALL**, who had 27 from 2007-10, for fourth-place. Brown, who is the fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, has rushed 252 times for 1,164 yards (4.62 average) and 14 scores starting under center. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (2002-05) is just ahead of Brown on the all-time quarterback rushing list with 1,182 yards.

"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets host Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

TAKING ATTENDANCE

Through 17 home dates, the Big South's seven football playing members are averaging a combined 7,715 fans per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference's record attendance average of 7,488 in 2007. Liberty leads the Big South with its 16,822 per game average, and Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Presbyterian College and Stony Brook are all posting average attendance gains over last season. The Conference needs to draw 129,845 during its remaining 20 home dates (=6,493 average) to break the all-time combined total home attendance record of 260,998 that was established in 2008.

BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE

- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.*
- iv. Road wins in Conference games.*
- v. Home wins in Conference games.*
- vi. Point system based on complete schedule and wins using the latest available Sagarin rankings as indicated below.*

* The Chanticleers won last year's meeting, 45-31, and last won two-straight over the Flames in 2005 and 2006.

* Coastal Carolina has not won in Lynchburg since a 27-24, triple-overtime contest on Oct. 22, 2005.

* The Chanticleers are 4-1 for just the third time in school history and first since 2005 (also accomplishing the feat in 2004).

* Coastal Carolina rushed for 214 yards in the win over VMI, improving to 37-4 all-time when eclipsing the 200-yard plateau.

* Coastal Carolina is 16th in the FCS in total offense (303.80) and 20th nationally in pass defense (173.20).
