BIG SOUTH KICKS OFF 10TH SEASON THIS WEEK

The Big South Conference begins Year 10 of its football history this week with all seven teams in action. Big South football teams are a combined 25-25 in season openers since 2002, including a League-best four wins in 2005, 2006 and 2010. Eleven of the 25 losses have been against FBS members. VMI owns the longest season-opening win streak in Big South history, as the Keydets have won their last six openers, including shutouts in 2005, 2007 and 2008. Gardner-Webb and Liberty have also won six season openers since the Conference began football.

TEAM-BY-TEAM OPENERS

Charleston Southern is opening the campaign on the road for the seventh time in the last eight seasons ... Coastal Carolina is opening at home for the first time since 2006 and just the third time overall in its nine-year history ... Gardner-Webb is opening at home for the third consecutive season ... Liberty will play its season opener on the road for the second time in three years -- both at FBS opponents ... Presbyterian College is opening its season at home for the first time since 2005 ... Stony Brook opens the slate on the road for the third-straight season and second consecutive year at an FBS foe ... VMI -- which is playing its 121th football season in 2011, will open at home for the seventh-straight year. Below is a team-by-team look at season openers:

LIBERTY PICKED TO WIN IT ALL IN 2011

For the fifth consecutive season, Liberty University has been tabbed as the favorite in the Big South Conference's annual preseason football poll for the 2011 campaign, as voted by the League's head coaches and media panel. The Flames, which have won or shared the Big South title each of the past four years, is the first team in League history to be chosen as the preseason favorite five-straight seasons.

BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets face Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 63 games, which is the second-longest in League history. The record is 67 games by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 52 games (34 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (33), Stony Brook (27) and Charleston Southern (19).

DOUBLE DOWN

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 27, the fourth-longest streak in Big South history. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped last season on Sept. 25 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes.

PERRY III WILL LIKELY BECOME PERRY I

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** enters the season with 181 career catches, third all-time in Big South history. He needs just 22 receptions to break the Conference record of 202, which is held by former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE**. Perry owns a career average of 5.66 receptions per game, and based on that output, he would break Price's record in GWU's fourth game of 2011, which is Oct. 1 at Samford.

LIBERTY'S BROWN TABBED PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

For the third consecutive season, Liberty redshirt-senior quarterback **MIKE BROWN** has been voted the Big South's Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Brown was the 2010 Big South Offensive Player of the Year -- the second back-to-back winner following a record-setting season. He led the nation in total offense with a Big South single-season record 346.4 yards per game, finishing the season with 3,810. Brown was the first quarterback in League history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season and reached 300 yards passing in three contests in 2010.

COASTAL CAROLINA'S JACOBS PICKED AS PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Coastal Carolina junior linebacker **ANDRAE JACOBS**, a 2011 preseason All-American by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* and *Lindy's*, has been voted the 2011 Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Tabbed the 2010 Big South Defensive Player of the Year -- the first Coastal Carolina player to be voted as the Conference's postseason honoree, Jacobs finished the 2010 season second in the Big South with a career-high 104 tackles (8.7 per game), having ranked first (eight weeks) and second (three weeks) in the Conference in tackles. He also had 12.0 tackles-for-loss.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He enters his final season in 2011 with 1,438 career rushing yards, 3,408 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

DID YOU KNOW...

... that Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** is seven receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions? Duran has 53 career catches, just six shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER's** Conference record of 59 from 2007-10.

FB-YES

For the second consecutive year, the Big South will play a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents this season. In 2010, the Conference picked up its first-ever wins against FBS members, **and did so on the same day** when Gardner-Webb and Liberty defeated MAC teams on Sept. 11. The Runnin' Bulldogs were the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South was the only FCS AQ Conference with two FBS wins in 2010.

CATCHING UP

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** enters the 2011 season with 124 career receptions for 1,698 yards and 19 touchdowns, and is one TD grab away from becoming the fourth Big South player with 20 career touchdown catches. Summers also is three catches away from cracking the League's top 10.

FUN FACT

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 36 games.

BIG BROWN

In just 12 career starts at quarterback, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is 252-of-387 passing (=65.1 percent) for 3,198 yards and 24 touchdowns, in addition to being 9-3. He also has rushed 180 times for 942 yards (5.2 average) and 10 scores starting under center.

THANK HEAVENS FOR BEVINS

Liberty senior **MATT BEVINS** is the Conference's all-time leader with 54 career field goals (54-of-69, =78.3 percent) and ranks second in Big South history with 268 career points kicking as well as fourth in overall scoring. He enters the 2011 season needing 30 points to break the Big South career kick scoring record of 297 points, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history.

300-TACKLE CLUB

Three Big South players enter the 2011 campaign with a chance to enter the Conference's 300-career tackle club, which currently has eight members. VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS** is the League's active leader entering the season with 263 career stops, ahead of teammate **BYRON ALLEN** (233). Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON** (221) returns after missing all of last year with an injury and is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Big South's 300-tackle list.

SOLO ARTIST

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL**, who is the Big South's all-time leader with six blocked kicks, is 10th in League history with 139 career solo tackles. He needs 17 to crack the top five and 29 for second-place. Former Charleston Southern LB **JADA ROSS** holds the career record for most solo tackles with 195.
