Kordenbrock set a VMI record with 31 pass completions and finished 31-of-47 passing for a career-high 320 yards and three touchdowns in the Keydets' near-upset of No. 22 Liberty, which entered the game with the Big South's second-best pass defense. He was the first VMI quarterback to throw for 300 yards in a game since 2003, and his three TD passes were the most by a Keydet signal-caller since 2007. Kordenbrock completed 66 percent of his passes, had a pass efficiency rating of 139.96 and led VMI to 31 points -- the most scored by a Conference opponent at Liberty since 2007.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JOSH NORMAN • CB • Senior

Norman finished with five solo tackles, one interception, one forced fumble, one quarterback hurry and a blocked field goal in Coastal Carolina's 15-8 victory over Presbyterian College. On PC's first drive, Norman intercepted a pass deep in CCU territory for his 13th career pick. On the final drive of the third quarter and with Coastal down, 8-7, Norman blocked a 42-yard field goal attempt. And on the second-to-last play of the game with Presbyterian on the Chanticleer 14-yard line, Norman blitzed from his corner spot to force Blue Hose quarterback Ryan Singer to throw the ball away for an incompleting.

Fogg returned four kickoffs for 153 yards (38.2 average) against VMI, including a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown midway through the third quarter that gave Liberty the lead for good. It was his third kickoff return touchdown this season -- tying the Big South single-season record, and he is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) with three kickoff return scores this season. Fogg also contributed six tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery against the Keydets.

NOV. 19 IS BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SATURDAY

The Nov. 19 season-finale between Liberty and Stony Brook will decide the Big South's automatic qualifier to the FCS playoffs. Regardless of the Seawolves' result at Gardner-Webb this Saturday, the winner of the Nov. 19 LU-SBU contest will claim the Conference's playoff bid. Liberty can clinch at least a share of the regular-season championship with a Stony Brook loss this Saturday at Gardner-Webb.

HIGH FIVE

Liberty is 5-0 in Big South play for the first time since 2009 and third time overall, as the Flames also finished 5-0 during its 2008 Big South Championship season. It is the fourth-straight season a Big South team has opened 5-0 in League play. Meanwhile, Stony Brook is 4-0 for the third-straight year and is looking to start 5-0 for the second consecutive season. The Big South has never had two 5-0 teams in the same season.

TALE OF THE TAPE

Stony Brook and Liberty are currently ranked No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in scoring offense and scoring defense in Conference games. The Seawolves are averaging 44.0 points and holding League foes to 17.2 points, while the Flames are second in both categories with 40.0 points and 19.4. Stony Brook's average winning margin in Big South games is 26.8, while Liberty's margin in League wins is 20.6.

CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE WON IN NOVEMBER

Four-time Big South football champion Liberty is 21-8 (=72.4 percent) since 2002 during the month of November, while two-time champ Stony Brook is 6-3 in November since joining the Big South in 2008. Two-time champion Coastal Carolina is 20-6 (=76.9) in its history in regular-season games in November. In fact, the Chanticleers are the only Big South member to win a game in November every season since 2003.

STONY BROOK EXTENDS BIG SOUTH RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE 40 POINT GAMES

Stony Brook has scored at least 40 points in a record five-straight games, and is now the first team in League annals with four-straight 40-point games in Big South contests. The previous record in both categories was three games. In their past five games, the Seawolves are averaging 46.2 points (44.0 in Conference games).

2,000 RUSHING ODYSSEY

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** became the 10th player in Big South history with 2,000 career rushing yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 9 against Coastal Carolina. Teammate **BROCK JACKOLSKI** became the 11th player to reach the benchmark this past weekend with his 174-yard rushing effort at Charleston Southern. Maysonet currently stands ninth at 2,306 and needs 38 rushing yards to pass Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343 from 2003-06) for eighth-place, as well as 174 yards to crack the League's all-time Top 5. Jackolski is currently 11th with 2,030 and is 185 yards away from 10th place.

RUNNING IN THE QUAD

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** recorded his second 4-touchdown game of the season with his four rushing scores at Charleston Southern this past Saturday. He is the first player in Big South history with two 4-touchdown games in a season, and now owns a League-record three 4-TD games in his career. Maysonet's five career games with at least three touchdowns in a game is second-most in Conference annals and two away from tying the mark of seven, which is held by Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS**.

MIGUEL'S MAYSONRY

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** is just the third player in Conference history with consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons. Currently at 1,178 this season -- eighth-highest in a Big South single-season, he joins Liberty backs **DRE BARNES** (2002-03) and **RASHAD JENNINGS** (2006-07-08) on the list. Maysonet needs 323 rushing yards to break Jennings' Big South single-season record of 1,500 in 2008. Meanwhile, Maysonet's 13 rushing touchdowns this season are four away from Jennings' single-season mark of 17 in '08.

BURNING UP THE HOUSE

Liberty owns a Big South-record 15-game home Conference win streak, and has swept its home Big South schedule for the fifth consecutive season. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 681 points (45.4 points per game), scored more than 30 points in 14 contests, and has held its League brethren to 274 points (18.2). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

WOLF DEN

Stony Brook has won nine consecutive home Big South games -- the second-longest streak in Conference history and trailing Liberty's current 15-game span. The Seawolves have scored 351 points during their string (39.0 points per game), have scored more than 30 points in seven contests -- including the last four over 40, and have held the Conference membership to 140 points (15.6). The last Big South team to defeat Stony Brook inside LaValle Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Nov. 1, 2008 (34-33).

POLL POSITION

Liberty is ranked No. 15 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 16 in the *Sports Network* ranking this week -- its highest rankings of the season and up from last week's No. 22 position in both polls. The Big South has had a team ranked nine out of 11 weeks this season, and has had two different teams nationally-ranked this year (Liberty and Coastal Carolina), the second time in League history two Big South teams were ranked in the same season.

DASH AND MASH

Stony Brook RBs **BROCK JACKOLSKI** and **MIGUEL MAYSONET** have scored touchdowns in the same game four times this season (all wins) and nine times overall since joining the Seawolves in 2010. SBU is 8-1 in those games (7-0 in Big South contests), with the two combining for 34 scores (Maysonet - 19, Jackolski - 15).

BUC-ING THE TREND

Charleston Southern WR **NATHAN PERERA** enjoyed a career day this past Saturday against Stony Brook. He caught 10 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns -- missing the Big South single-game record for most receiving yards by three. Perera's yardage was nine yards shy of the school record of 241 yards, and he is the first Buccaneer with 10 receptions in a game since former WR **GERALD STEVENSON** had 12 catches last season against Stony Brook.

BIG SOUTH BICENTENNIALS

Big South teammates have rushed for 100 yards in the same game six times this year. Gardner-Webb and Stony Brook have done so twice, followed by Charleston Southern and Presbyterian College. It is tied for the most such occurrences in Conference history, as the League had 100-yard rushing teammates in six games in 2004 and 2008. Meanwhile, Stony Brook's tandem of **MIGUEL MAYSONET** and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** have rushed for 100 yards in the same game a total of five times since 2010.

"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** played the 100th game in program history this past Saturday, and the Chanticleers were victorious in the milestone contest with their 15-8 win over Presbyterian College. Speaking of 100 games, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. In addition, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets host Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty holds the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 73, having broken the old mark of 67 earlier this year that was first established by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 61 games (43 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (42), Stony Brook (36) and VMI (17).

GROUND CHUCK

Stony Brook RB duo **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (1,178) and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (1,001) are the first set of teammates in Big South history to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. In 2010, Maysonet had 1,128 and Jackolski gained 1,029. The tandem has combined for 2,179 rushing yards this season -- second-most in League annals. The most rushing yards by two teammates in Big South history is 2,505, set by former SBU backs **EDWIN GOWINS** (1,310) and **CONTE CUTTINO** (1,195) in 2008.

BIG SOUTH'S 300-30 TACKLE CLUB GETS NEW MEMBER

Gardner-Webb LB **MARTY PATTERSON** finished with seven tackles last Thursday against Virginia State, giving him exactly 300 in his career. He is now just the third player in Big South history with 300 tackles and 30 TFL (33.5). Patterson, who is the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Conference's 300-tackle list and 10th overall, joins Charleston Southern LB **JADA ROSS** (2004-07), who had a Big South career record 454 stops in addition to 32.5 tackles-for-loss, and VMI's **A.J. GROSS**, who is fifth all-time in League annals with 326 tackles to go along with his 33.0 TFL.

MARGINAL NOTE

Nine of the 15 Big South Conference games this season have been decided by double figures, including six by at least 20 points, and the average winning margin currently sits at 17.9 points. Last year, the 21 Conference football games were decided by 20.8 points.

RUNNIN' BULLDOGS ALLOW FEWEST NET RUSHING YARDS IN SINGLE-GAME

Gardner-Webb limited Virginia State to minus-25 net rushing yards last Thursday, a Big South single-game record for fewest net rushing yards allowed in a contest. The previous record was minus-20, which was established by Liberty against Kentucky Wesleyan on Sept. 20, 2003.

SEAWOLVES ALLOW FEWEST NET RUSHING YARDS IN CONFERENCE GAME

One week after allowing the fewest total offensive yards in a Big South game (73 to Coastal Carolina), the Stony Brook Seawolves set the League record for lowest net rushing yards allowed in a Conference contest after holding Charleston Southern to minus-7 yards on the ground on 32 carries. The previous low was minus-1 yard, which was established by Liberty against the Buccaneers on Nov. 1, 2003.

FLOCK OF SEAWOLVES

Stony Brook has tied the Big South single-season record by holding seven opponents under 100 yards rushing in a contest. The Seawolves join Gardner-Webb and Liberty, who both accomplished the feat in 2008. Stony Brook's rushing defense average of 77.8 ranks fifth in the nation and is pacing way ahead of the Big South single-season record of 108.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2006. The Seawolves have held their last four opponents to under 100 yards rushing -- the second-longest streak in Conference annals. The record is six consecutive games, which was set by the '08 GWU Runnin' Bulldogs.

SOLO ARTISTS

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL**, the Big South's all-time leader with nine blocked kicks, is second in Big South history with 194 career solo tackles, and is two solo stops away from breaking the Conference's career record of 195 established by Charleston Southern LB **JADA ROSS** from 2004-07. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb LB **MARTY PATTERSON** moved into the career Top 10 in Week 7 and is now tied for third in League history with 167 career solo tackles.

HIGH DENSITY FOGG

Liberty kick returner **KEVIN FOGG** returned his third kickoff for a touchdown this season on Saturday, tying the Big South single-season record first established by Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** in 2010. Fogg is averaging a national-best 34.9 yards on his kickoff returns, which is 2.9 yards ahead of the Big South single-season record of 32.0, which was set by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2007.

MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE

Coastal Carolina sophomore **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is tied with Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** (2003-07) as the Big South's all-time leader with 43 career punt returns. Mastromatteo is fourth in League annals with 319 career punt return yards, 206 yards away from Jackson's Big South mark of 525. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is fifth in Big South history with 87 combined kick returns in his brief career (44 KR, 43 PR). Former Gardner-Webb WR **TYSON PETTY** (2007-10) is fourth with 89.

CATCHING UP

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is third in Big South history with 26 career touchdown receptions, and is four TD grabs shy of becoming the third player with 30. Summers is currently fourth in League history with 178 career catches and needs 10 receptions for the third spot. He became the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 4 (now fourth at 2,472), and is 81 yards from moving into third all-time. Since the start of the 2010 season, Summers has 130 receptions, 1,855 yards and 22 touchdowns in 20 games played.

THAT'S A FACT, JACK

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** is eighth in Big South history with 3,586 career all-purpose yards and is nine away from seventh-place. Jackolski's per game average of 180.0 this season is pacing just ahead of the Big South single-season record of 179.5 (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2007). With 1,620 all-purpose yards this season, Jackolski needs to average 177.5 over the final two games to break Maypray's Big South single-season record of 1,975 yards.

LIBERTY'S 4x1,000-YARD RELAY TEAM

Liberty WR **PAT KELLY** surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards at Charleston Southern in Week 8, making Liberty the lone FCS program in the nation with four active players with 1,000 career receiving yards. The quartet is comprised of **CHRIS SUMMERS** (2,472), **B.J. HAYES** (1,131), Kelly (1,180) and **MIKE BROWN** (1,054).

GO LONG

Five of Liberty WR **PAT KELLY**'s seven career touchdown receptions have gone for 50-yards or longer. He had three last season (79 and 65 yards vs. Stony Brook on Nov. 20, and a 75-yarder vs. St. Francis, Pa., on Sept., 4), and has two this year (50-yarder vs. Coastal Carolina in Week 7 and 52 yards at Charleston Southern in Week 8).

PASSING GRADE

VMI quarterback **ERIC KORDENBROCK** completed a school-record 31 passes this past Saturday at Liberty, breaking the old single-game record of 27 set by **KIRK MONTELEONE** against the Flames in 2004. Kordenbrock is the first Big South QB with 30 completions in a game since Gardner-Webb's **STAN DOOLITTLE** had 32 against the Keydets on Oct. 3, 2009. In addition, Kordenbrock's 320 passing yards against the Flames was the first 300-yard passing game for a VMI quarterback since **JONATHAN WILSON** had 306 yards against Austin Peay on Nov. 8, 2003. Lastly, Kordenbrock had the first 3-TD pass game for a Keydets signal-caller since **KYLE HUGHES** had three against Charleston Southern on Nov. 3, 2007.

MOUNCE BY MOUNCE

Since replacing injured starting quarterback **MALCOLM DIXON** three games ago against Liberty, Charleston Southern QB **RICHARD MOUNCE** has 47 pass completions for 704 yards (=14.98 yards per completion) with six touchdown passes in that span, in addition to averaging 266.0 yards of total offense. He threw for a career-high 342 yards and three touchdown passes this past Saturday against Stony Brook -- the second time this season the Buccaneers have passed for 300 yards in a game.

DOUBLED UP

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 33. Stony Brook has the next-longest active streak at 20 games. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 45 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 41 of its League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (16 games).

OH, THERE YOU ARE PERRY

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** is the Big South's all-time receptions leader with 216 career catches. He is fourth among active players in career receptions in the Football Championship Subdivision. Perry, who broke the League's receptions record in Week 6 against Liberty, is second in League history with 2,573 career receiving yards, and he needs 148 to break the Big South career record in that category. The current record is 2,720 yards set by former Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** from 2004-07.

SKIFF AND WESSON

Stony Brook PK **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON**, who became the school's all-time kick scoring leader in Week 4, ranks seventh in Big South history with 192 career points kicking. He is six points away from sixth-place. Skiffington is the sixth kicker in League annals with 100 career PATs (108) and needs two field goals to become the sixth Big South kicker with 30 in a career.

TOTAL RECALL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who has a Big South-record 14 career 300-total offense games, remains fourth in League history with 7,564 career yards of total offense. He is 309 yards away from third-place, which is held by Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (7,872 yards from 2002-05). Meanwhile, Brown's six 300-yard offensive games this year is tied for third-most in a single-season in Big South history.

BIG BROWN

In his 21 career starts at quarterback, Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** has thrown for more than 200 yards a total of 20 times -- including 17 consecutive contests at one point. He is 425-of-650 passing (=65.4 percent) for 5,501 yards (262.0 per start) and 41 touchdowns as a starter, in addition to being 15-6.

BROWN DELIVERING TOUCHDOWN PASSES

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who became the sixth player in Big South history with 40 career touchdown passes when he eclipsed the milestone in Week 8, has thrown a TD pass in each of his nine games played this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at 12. The last Big South QB with 12-straight games with a TD pass was Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN**, who threw a touchdown pass in all 12 games of the 2006 season. Brown's streak of consecutive games with at least two touchdown passes was snapped at six in Week 9, and that effort is tied for the top spot in Big South history.

GROUND PACKAGE

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is tied for fourth all-time in Big South history with 27 career rushing touchdowns. Brown's seven rushing touchdowns this season are the fourth-most by a Big South quarterback in a single-season, and two away from matching his total from last year. The fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, Brown has rushed 298 times for 1,357 yards (4.55 average) and 17 scores starting under center. He is the Big South's third-leading all-time rusher among quarterbacks, and he is two rushing touchdowns away from tying the Conference's all-time mark for a QB (19 - Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS**, 2002-05).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Gardner-Webb has won three consecutive games in a season for the first time since 2008. The Runnin' Bulldogs' current three-game win streak is their longest since winning the 2009 season finale and the first two games of the 2010 campaign. Gardner-Webb has not won four-straight games since 2006.

YOU COMPLETE ME

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the Big South's all-time career leader for completion percentage at 65.0 percent (446-of-686). He recorded his fourth career 300-yard passing game in Week 6 at Gardner-Webb, the third-most in League history. Brown also threw three touchdown passes against the Runnin' Bulldogs, marking the fifth time in his career he has achieved the feat -- the fourth-most 3-TD pass games in Conference annals.

HEY NORM!

Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN**, who became the Big South's all-time leader in career pass break-ups in Week 7, owns a record career total of 34. Norman remains second to former Chanticleer safety **QUINTON TEAL** (2003-06) in Conference annals with 47 passes defensed and 13 interceptions, as Teal holds the all-time marks of 48 PD and 17 INT.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards (1,853), 1,000 career passing yards (5,711) and 1,000 career receiving yards (1,054).

RUSHING UPDATE

Liberty RB **ALDREAKIS ALLEN** and Gardner-Webb's **KENNY LITTLE** each surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards this past week. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** is the second player in Big South history with 2,000 career rushing yards (2,030) and 1,000 career kickoff return yards (1,314). He joins VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**, who had 2,456 rushing yards and 2,181 kickoff return yards from 2006-09.

50-50 PROPOSITION

With 54 pass receptions this year, Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** is the seventh player in Big South history with two 50-catch seasons. He needs six receptions to become just the third player in League annals with two 60-reception campaigns. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb WR **JAMES PERRY III** needs 15 catches to become the first player in Conference history with four 50-reception seasons.

AUSTIN POWERS

Gardner-Webb freshman K **TREVER AUSTIN** has three 10-point kicking games this season, and he is just the second freshman (true or redshirt) with that many in Big South history. The first was former Runnin' Bulldog kicker **RYAN GATES** in 2008. Austin's 11 field goals this year are five away from the League freshman record of 16, which was set by Gates in '08.

BROCK ALLEN

Stony Brook RB **BROCK JACKOLSKI** and Liberty RB **ALDREAKIS ALLEN** have each scored touchdowns in their last five games. The last Big South player to score a TD in at least five consecutive contests was former Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL**, who scored a rushing touchdown in the final six games of the 2010 regular-season.

BEVINS IS THE BIG SOUTH'S CAREER SCORING LEADER

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** is the Big South's all-time scoring leader with 305 points. Despite missing considerable time this season with an injury, he remains second among active FCS kickers in career field goals with a Big South-record 58 -- two away from becoming just the 12th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals.

ON TOP OF LIBERTY MOUNTAIN

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (36.4) and scoring defense (20.1), a feat they accomplished in 2007, 2009 and 2010. The Flames are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead in scoring offense three consecutive seasons, while their defensive prowess has them on track to have the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented sixth-straight campaign.

BLUE HAZE

Presbyterian College rushed for a season-high 287 yards at Liberty in Week 9, its highest rushing total in a Big South game since becoming official Conference opponents in 2009. It was the most rushing yards allowed by the Flames since James Madison rushed for 301 yards in 2009. PC RB **LANCE BYRD** gained 111 yards and QB **RYAN SINGER** had 108, marking the first time Liberty allowed two 100-yard rushers in a Big South game. The last time a pair of teammates rushed for 100 yards in the same game was in 2002, when VMI's **T.J. SNELLING** (125) and **SEAN MIZZER** (121) did so on Oct. 26, 2002 -- VMI's final season in the SoCon.

RHODIE

Gardner-Webb RB **RICKY RHODES** has thrown two touchdown passes this season out of the Wildcat formation. He is the Big South's first non-quarterback with two TD throws in a campaign since former Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON** tossed two touchdown passes in 2010.

HOW FAR DID IT FLY?

Gardner-Webb P **GRAHAM PURVIS** boomed an 85-yard punt against Charleston Southern in Week 9, the longest punt in Big South history and 12 yards longer than the previous record of 73 (GWU's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** in 2002). Late in the fourth quarter, Purvis punted from his 15-yard line, and with the wind at his back, the kick sailed over CSU's returner and rolled into the end zone for a touchback. Purvis, who also had a 67-yard punt in the game, which is the sixth-longest punt in Conference history, finished the day with 11 punts for a Big South single-game record 497 yards -- a 45.2 yard average.

SINGING IN THE RAIN

Presbyterian College QB **RYAN SINGER** scored a 74-yard rushing touchdown at Liberty in Week 9, his second career rushing score of at least 70 yards -- with both coming against the Flames. Singer is the second quarterback in Big South history with two runs of 70 yards-or-longer, joining former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN**, who had a 77-yarder for a score against VMI in 2005 and a 76-yard rush at Gardner-Webb in 2006. Meanwhile, Singer became the seventh different quarterback in Big South history with 100 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game with his 114 passing, 108 rushing performance at Liberty.

NO LONGER ROOSTER FEED

Gardner-Webb's 26-24 victory over Coastal Carolina in Week 8 ended the Runnin' Bulldogs' seven-game losing streak to the Chanticleers. Coastal's run was the second-longest win streak over one Big South member, as Gardner-Webb's current eight-game win streak over VMI is the longest in League history. The Runnin' Bulldogs face the Keydets in the Nov. 19 season finale in Lexington. Liberty owns the third-longest streaks, as the Flames have now defeated Charleston Southern and VMI six consecutive times each.

TAKING ATTENDANCE

Through 31 home dates, the Big South's seven football playing members are averaging a combined 7,502 fans per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference's record attendance average of 7,488 in 2007. Liberty leads the Big South with its 16,419 per game average, and Coastal Carolina and Presbyterian College are posting average attendance gains over last season. The Conference needs to draw 28,427 during its remaining six home dates (=4,738 average) to break the all-time combined total home attendance record of 260,998 that was established in 2008.

MEET THE CANDIDATES

The Big South currently has two candidates for the top individual awards in FCS. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is a candidate for the Walter Payton Award (offense), while Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** was a midseason addition to the Buck Buchanan Award (defense) on Oct. 4. A national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the Payton and Buchanan awards after the regular season, beginning Nov. 21.
