### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MIGUEL MAYSONET • RB • Junior**  
Stony Brook • Riverhead, N.Y.

Maysonet tied a school, Big South and LaValle Stadium record with four rushing touchdowns in Stony Brook's 37-20 win over Lafayette. He rushed 22 times for a career-high 194 yards -- 156 of which came in the second half. He did not carry the ball until the middle of the first quarter and had just seven first-half rushes. Maysonet accounted for all of the Seawolves' four touchdowns in the final 30 minutes with scores from 35, 1, 30 and 9 yards, respectively, as Stony Brook earned its first win of the season.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**DAN MULROONEY • SS • Junior**  
Stony Brook • Prospect, Conn.

Mulrooney finished with eight total tackles (five solo, three assisted), 1.5 TFL, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and an interception in Stony Brook's victory over Lafayette. In his first start with the Seawolves, he single-handedly ended three drives and made two touchdown saving tackles from behind. He ended Lafayette's second drive of the game with an interception, followed by a forced fumble on a 2nd-and-Goal situation to keep the Leopards out of the end zone in the second quarter. Mulrooney then recovered a fumble in Lafayette territory that led to a Seawolves' touchdown in the third period.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**WESLEY SKIFFINGTON • PK • R-Junior**  
Stony Brook • Brandon, Fla.

Skiffington was perfect on all seven of his place-kicks against Lafayette and finished the game with 13 points. He made 3-of-3 field goals, connecting from 37 and 36 yards in the first half that brought Stony Brook back from a 6-0 deficit. Skiffington then added a career-long 46-yard field goal in the third quarter to give SBU a 10-point lead, and was accurate on all four PAT attempts. He also became Stony Brook's all-time leader in kick scoring with 164 points, breaking the old record of 156.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**DEMARCUS ROUSE • RB**  
Presbyterian College • North Augusta, S.C.

Rouse scored two rushing touchdowns against Furman for his first career multi-touchdown game. He scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter that was PC's first offensive touchdown since Week 2, and later capped an 11-play, 72-yard drive with a 7-yard run early in the fourth quarter. Rouse finished the day as the Blue Hose's top rusher against the Paladins with 38 yards on nine carries.

**FOUR SCORE AND SEVEN SEASONS AGO**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** tied a Big South single-game record with four rushing touchdowns this past Saturday against Lafayette, the first player to achieve this feat in seven seasons (Charleston Southern's **ANDRE COPELAND** was the last on Oct. 15, 2005 against West Virginia Wesleyan). Maysonet, who is the fourth player in League history to score four rushing TDs in a game, is now the only player in Conference annals with two career 4-touchdown games.

**SUMMERS WIND**

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** set a Big South single-game record with 15 receptions this past Saturday at No. 15/16 Lehigh, breaking the mark of 14 he shared with Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**. Summers' 15 catches against the Mountain Hawks went for 205 yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in League history. It was his eighth career game with more than 100 yards receiving, which is second-most on the all-time list and two shy of former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE**'s career record of 10.

**AGENT P**

Gardner-Webb redshirt-senior WR **JAMES PERRY III** needs seven receptions to break the Big South career record of 202, which is held by former Charleston Southern WR **MAURICE PRICE** (2004-06). Perry has 196 and is second among active players in career receptions in the Football Championship Subdivision, trailing Butler's **ZACH WATKINS** by eight.

**LIBERTY FALLS OUT OF RANKINGS; COASTAL ON CUSP OF TOP 25**

For the first time since Oct. 12, 2009, the Liberty Flames are not ranked in either Top 25 national poll. The Flames' streak has ended at 24 consecutive weeks appearing in either the *Sports Network* or FCS Coaches poll following its 1-3 start to the season. Meanwhile, the 3-1 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers are No. 27 in the FCS Coaches poll this week, and are getting closer to their first national ranking since being ranked No. 20/23 in the 2007 preseason national polls.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty has tied the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 67, matching the mark that was first set by Coastal Carolina from 2003-08. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 56 games (38 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (36) and Stony Brook (31).

**HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF**

Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** is two receptions away from becoming the first tight end in Big South history with 60 career receptions. Duran has 58 career catches, just one shy of former Gardner-Webb TE **JOSH MILLER**'s Conference record of 59 from 2007-10. Meanwhile, Duran is 180 yards away from becoming the first Big South tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards.

**TOTAL RECALL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** became the sixth player in Big South history with 6,000 career total offensive yards when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday at No. 15/16 Lehigh. He now has 6,148 for his career and is 991 away from fifth-place in Conference history (7,139 - Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MacDOWALL** from 2008-10).

**BLOCK OF AGES**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** is the first player in Big South history to block a punt and return it for a touchdown in consecutive games. The Conference's all-time leader now with eight career blocked kicks, Bethel blocked Furman's punt attempt and landed on it in the end zone this past Saturday, one week after blocking a California punt and returning it 17 yards for a score against the Golden Bears. Bethel is the sixth player in League history with two punt return TDs in a single-season, and the first since 2008.

**AREA CODE 300**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** finished with a season-high 361 yards of offense against No. 15/16 Lehigh, his third game over 300 this season and the 11th of his career -- tying the all-time Conference record established by Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (2003-06). Brown's three 300-yard offensive games is already the fifth-most in a single-season in Big South history.

**HOME EQUITY**

Stony Brook is just the third team in Big South football history to play four consecutive home games in a single-season, joining the 2005 Liberty Flames and 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Liberty went 0-4 during its streak, while the Buccaneers were 4-0 during their four-game home stand. The Seawolves are 1-1 on thus far. Stay tuned.

**NORTH BY NORTHWEST**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** recorded his third 100-yard rushing game in four weeks as he gained 194 against Lafayette this past Saturday. It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game with the Seawolves, tied for ninth all-time in Big South history with former SBU rusher **CONTE CUTTINO** (2008-09). Maysonet leads the Big South with 542 rushing yards, and is fifth nationally with 135.5 rushing yards per game.

**WOLF TRAP**

Stony Brook leads the Big South in rushing defense at 78.8 rushing yards allowed and is eighth in the nation in the category. The Seawolves have held three of its first four opponents under 100 yards rushing, a feat last accomplished in the Big South by Gardner-Webb and Liberty through the first four games of 2008.

**SOLO ARTIST**

Presbyterian College DB **JUSTIN BETHEL** recorded 12 solo tackles against Furman this past Saturday, pushing his career total to 163 and into a tie for fourth-place in Big South history with former Gardner-Webb DB **DANIEL COOKE** (2005-08). Bethel, who became the second defensive player in Big South history with two touchdowns in a game in Week 3, needs four solo stops for second-place. His interception streak was snapped at three games this past weekend.

**MORE SOLO ACTS**

Charleston Southern DB **CHRIS KUZDALE** leads the Big South with 28 solo tackles and surpassed 100 career solo stops this past Saturday against Norfolk State. He stands at 107. Coastal Carolina DB **JOSH NORMAN** and VMI LB **A.J. GROSS** also eclipsed the century mark for career solo tackles this past weekend. Norman's career total is 103 while Gross is at 102. Norman's teammate **MARCUS LOTT** is three shy of 100 career solo tackles.

**THAT'S A FACT, JACK**

Stony Brook RB/KR **BROCK JACKOLSKI** amassed 204 all-purpose yards this past Saturday against Lafayette with 98 rushing yards and 106 kickoff return yards. It was his fourth career 200-yard all-purpose game, and the kickoff return yardage pushed his career total to 1,072 -- eighth all-time in Big South history. He is now ninth in League annals in combined kick return yards (punt and kickoff) at 1,072.

**300-TACKLE CLUB ACCEPTING NEW MEMBERS**

VMI linebacker **A.J. GROSS** is seven tackles away from becoming the ninth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. He is the League's active leading-tackler with 293 career stops, ahead of teammate **BYRON ALLEN** (243). Gardner-Webb's **MARTY PATTERSON** saw his first action of the season at Wake Forest in Week 3 and recorded four tackles against the Demon Deacons to push his career total to 225. Patterson is looking to become the fourth Runnin' Bulldog on the Big South's 300-tackle list.

**BOOM-TOWN**

Presbyterian College's **PATRICK MORGANO** and Liberty's **MIKE LARSSON** are both averaging better than 43.0 yards per punt this season. Morgano is tops in the Big South with his 43.3 punting average, just ahead of Larsson's 43.1 clip. They are the lone punters averaging more than 40.0 thus far, and if they can maintain that benchmark, it would be just the third time in League history that two punters averaged 40.0 yards per punt in the same season. The Big South has never had two punters average more than 43.0 yards in the same year.

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty redshirt-senior **CHRIS SUMMERS** is third in Big South history with 23 career touchdown receptions, and is seven TD grabs shy of becoming the third player with 30. Summers is currently seventh in League history with 150 career catches and needs two receptions for the sixth spot. He became the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday (now at 2,096), and is 45 yards from moving into fifth all-time. Since the start of the 2010 season, Summers has 102 receptions, 1,479 yards and 19 touchdowns in 14 games played.

**GROUND PACKAGE**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is fifth all-time in Big South history with 23 career rushing touchdowns and needs four to tie former Gardner-Webb rusher **PATRICK HALL**, who had 27 from 2007-10, for fourth-place. Brown, who is the fifth player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards at the quarterback position, has rushed 247 times for 1,161 yards (4.70 average) and 13 scores starting under center. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (2002-05) is just ahead of Brown on the all-time quarterback rushing list with 1,182 yards.

**THE FIRST FOUR**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET**'s 542 rushing yards in the first four games of the season is the most by a Big South player since former Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** gained 542 through the first four games of 2006. Two years later during his rushing record-setting season of 2008, Jennings had 429 yards rushing after four games before finishing with an all-time League-best 1,500. Meanwhile, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**'s 1,083 passing yards after four games this season is the most by a Conference quarterback since he threw for 1,084 yards in the same span last year. In addition, Brown's 84 pass completions thus far is the most after four contests since he completed 86 in 2010. Lastly, Brown's 1,302 yards of total offense in the first four games of the year are the most since former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** accumulated 1,321 during the first four games of 2006.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. He currently stands at 1,657 career rushing yards, 4,491 career passing yards and 1,049 career receiving yards.

**FOGG ALERT**

Liberty KR **KEVIN FOGG** leads the Big South with a 31.3 kickoff return average, which ranks eighth in the nation. If Fogg can maintain his average for the remainder of the season, he would challenge the Big South single-season record of 32.0, which was set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** in 2007. Bolden is the only player in Big South history to average more than 30.0 yards on kickoff returns for an entire season.

**AIR MAIL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for at least 200 yards in every game during the season in 2010, has now surpassed that yardage total in 15 consecutive games after passing for 297 yards this past Saturday against No. 15/16 Lehigh. In just 16 career starts at quarterback, Brown has thrown for more than 200 yards in each contest, is 336-of-515 passing ( =65.2 percent) for 4,281 yards and 31 touchdowns, in addition to being 10-6.

**SKIFF AND WESSON**

Stony Brook PK **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** became the school's all-time kick scoring leader this past Saturday after making three field goals and four extra-points against Lafayette. His career total of 164 points ranks seventh in Big South history, and he is two field goals shy of becoming the sixth kicker in League annals with 30 in a career.

**EXPRESS DELIVERY**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is seventh in Big South history with 34 career touchdown passes and is six-scoring strikes away from becoming the sixth player with 40. Brown has thrown a TD pass in each of the first four games this season, and his personal streak of consecutive games with a touchdown pass now stands at seven. The last Big South QB with seven-straight games with a TD pass was Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** (final game of 2009 and first six games of 2010).

**SIR CHARLES**

Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** became the seventh player in Big South history with 10 career interceptions when he picked off his second pass of the year at Jacksonville in Week 3. He is tied for fifth-place all-time in League annals, and his 25-yard return against the Dolphins pushed his career interception return yardage to 143 -- which vaulted him to fifth in that category as well. Of his 10 career INTs, three have come against FBS opponents (2 at Hawai'i in 2010 and 1 at Florida State in Week 2).

**SECOND FIDDLE?**

Four of the seven Big South teams have scored at least 60 percent of their points this season in the second half. Charleston Southern has scored 76.7 percent of its points in the last 30 minutes (33 of 43), while VMI has scored 39 of its 60 points in the second half (=65.0 percent), including 36 points in the final 15 minutes of the game. Stony Brook has tallied 55 of its 88 points in the second stanza (=62.5 percent). Liberty has scored 66 of its 107 points after halftime (=61.7 percent), including a League-high 46 third quarter points.

**ALL-AMERICAN KICKER MATT BEVINS SUFFERS INJURY AGAINST JAMES MADISON**

Liberty All-American PK **MATT BEVINS** suffered an injury against No. 13/14 James Madison in Week 3 and did not play at No. 15/16 Lehigh. He is still the NCAA's active FCS leader in career field goals with a Big South-record 57 -- three away from becoming just the 11th kicker in the classification's history with 60 career field goals. Bevins ranks second in Big South history with 283 career points kicking as well as third in overall scoring. He needs 15 points to break the Big South career kick scoring record of 297 points, which is held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06). Bevins' 11 career 10-point kicking games is most in League history, and he needs 15 PATs for second in Conference annals.

**GOOD WILL HUNT-ING**

Charleston Southern DL **WILL HUNT** tied a Big South single-game record with 5.0 tackles-for-loss against Jacksonville in Week 3. Hunt is the fifth player to accomplish this feat and the first since VMI's **A.J. GROSS** did it against Coastal Carolina on Oct. 11, 2008.

**MARIO BROTHERS**

VMI TE **MARIO THOMPSON** became the first tight end in Big South history with 100 receiving yards in a game with his 114 at No. 6/9 Richmond in Week 3. His 70-yard touchdown pass play against the Spiders was the second-longest reception by a tight end in League annals -- just two yards shy of the record of 72 yards set by Charleston Southern's **CLAYTON COFFMAN** against North Greenville on Sept. 30, 2006.

**SHIP SHAPE**

Charleston Southern QB **MALCOLM DIXON** rushed 27 times for 163 yards at Jacksonville in Week 3, the second-most rushing attempts and rushing yards in a single-game by a Big South quarterback in League history. Teammate **TEDDY ALLEN** added 125 rushing yards against the Dolphins, marking the first time since 1992 that Charleston Southern had two players rush for 100 yards in the same game. Meanwhile, the Bucs finished with 327 yards on the ground at Jacksonville, their most since 397 vs. West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005.

**HE LIKELY REACHED THE BAY BRIDGE**

Presbyterian College punter **PATRICK MORGANO**'s nine punts at California in Week 3 went for a Big South single-game record 465 yards -- an average of 51.7 yards and the second-highest single-game punting average in Conference history. Morgano had five 50-yard punts against the Golden Bears, including a long of 63, plus a 57 and 58-yarder. The old record for punting yardage was 458 on 10 punts by Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** at Georgia Tech on Oct. 11, 2008.

**BIG SOUTH HAS TWO WALTER PAYTON CANDIDATES**

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List in the same season. Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**, who was a finalist last year and finished 11th in the voting, made the 2011 list, as did teammate WR **CHRIS SUMMERS**. This marks the fifth time since 2006 that the Big South has had official candidates for the top offensive individual honor in FCS.

**"I'LL TAKE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR 100 PLEASE, ALEX"**

Coastal Carolina and head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will play the 100th game in program history this year when the Chanticleers host Presbyterian College in the ninth game of the season on Nov. 5. In addition, Charleston Southern head coach **JAY MILLS** will coach his 100th game at the helm of the Buccaneers when CSU faces PC in the season finale on Nov. 19. Meanwhile, VMI will play its 100th game as Big South members this year when the Keydets host Gardner-Webb on Nov. 19.

**FB-YES**

For the second consecutive year, the Big South played a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents this season. Stony Brook came the closest to picking up the Big South's third win against an FBS member by leading UTEP for most of the game before falling by seven points in overtime. In 2010, the Conference picked up its first-ever wins against FBS members, **and did so on the same day** when Gardner-Webb and Liberty defeated MAC teams on Sept. 11. The Big South was the only FCS AQ Conference with two FBS wins in 2010.
