She got her week started with 19 points on 67 percent from the field, one from long range and a pair of free throws in the 64-45 win over the College of Charleston on Nov. 30. Alston also finished the game with four rebounds, a block, an assist and two take-aways.

BCS BUSTERS

The first weekend in December proved to be a big one for the Big South Conference. On Friday, Dec. 2, ERIN REYNOLDS of High Point fueled the Panther offense with 36 points to lead High Point to the 82-75 win over Pitt of the Big East ... Two days later, Charleston Southern's LAKEITHA ALSTON posted a 31-point, 10 rebound double-double in the Bucs' 82-77 win over Clemson of the ACC.

THAT'S RIGHT ICE-MAN... I AM DANGEROUS

Junior guard DIANA CHOIBEKOVA has established herself as one of the League's most dangerous shooters from beyond the arc. She currently ranks No. 1 in all of Division I with 4.30 triples per game. She has also scored in double-digits in all but one game this season, including 33 points against Niagra.

McLEADING SCORER

Winthrop's DEQUESHA MCCLANAHAN has taken over as the Big South's leading scorer with 19.4 points per game. She has scored 20-or-more points in four games this season, including a season-high 29 against Stetson ... She also tops the Big South with 6.71 assists per game.

20/20

UNC Asheville's KELLI RILES set a new Big South single-game standard for rebounds as she pulled down 28 rebounds in Asheville's win over USC Upstate on Nov. 30. The game marked the second time this season that she has posted a game with 20-or-more rebounds as she pulled down 24 against Winston-Salem State in the opening game of the season ... In the game vs. WSSU, she also became the only player this season with a 20-point, 20-rebound double-double ... Her 13.7 rebounds per game is currently ranked No. 1 in the nation.

SCORE'N AND DISH'N

Winthrop's DEQUESHA MCCLANAHAN and TONISHA BAKER of Campbell have each posted doubledoubles with 10 assists. McClanahan put in 20-points and dished out 10 helpers against Troy, while Baker scored 18 points and posted 10 assists against Winston-Salem State.

I'LL TAKE PLAYERS AVERAGING A DOUBLE-DOUBLE THIS SEASON ALEX

The Big South has three student-athletes currently averaging a double-double in points and rebounds this season. High Point's CHEYENNE PARKER is averaging 15.9 points and 11.0 rebounds per game, while AVERY WARLEY of Liberty is averaging 11.4 points and 10.7 boards per game. UNC Asheville's KELLI RILES is currently posting 12.8 points and 13.7 rebounds per outing.

TWIN KILL'N

This season the Big South Conference has had five teammates go for 20 points in the same contest. During all of last season the Big South only saw seven sets of teammates go for 20 points in the same game.

GOOD 'N' TWENTY

Radford's DANARIA ERWIN SPENCER and McClanahan of Winthrop are the only players in the Big South to post consecutive 20-point games this season. Erwin Spencer poured in 21 points against USC Upstate on Nov. 19 and followed with 27 points against UNC Greensboro on Nov. 21. Radford picked up the win in both those contests. McClanahan posted 20 points against Virginia Commonwealth on Nov. 27 and followed with 21 points against Davidson on Dec. 1.

NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

CAMPBELL
Campbell improved to 6-1 on the season with a win over Winston-Salem State on Tuesday, marking the sixth time in school history that a CU team has collected at least six wins in its first seven games, and the first since the 1985-86 season when the Lady Camels started 11-0. The Lady Camels are 4-0 at home this season. The crowd of 2,754 that witnessed CU down the Rams is the second-largest home crowd to ever see a Campbell women's basketball game. The game's crowd is surpassed only by last season's Education Day, who sold out Gore Area with 3,095 spectators (Dec. 14, 2010). TONISHA BAKER poured in 18 points, 10 assists, seven steals and six rebounds against WSSU, collecting her third double-double of the year, a team high. Baker's 10 assists and seven steals both rank as career highs, while the junior's 18 points is a season-best. Junior forward JAZMINE COOPER added 13 points and six rebounds, while sophomore post ROSLYN PRESLEY tacked on 14 points off the bench, tying a career high. Sophomore guard JESSICA MOORE also registered a career-high 10 points off the bench, going a perfect 4-for-4 with a pair of threes. The game was CUS first this season with four in double figures, and the first since the Lady Camels defeated Lipscomb at home last year (Feb. 14, 2011). KATE CLOXTON added six assists in the game, marking the fifth time in her seven games with a half dozen dimes fifth time in her seven games with a half dozen dimes

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN
Buccaneers went 2-0 on the week, winning the battle of Charleston with a 64-45 win at the College of Charleston before earning their first ever win over a program from a major conference with an 82-77 win at Clemson... The Bucs are now 5-1 vs. nonconference opponents from the Palmetto State, with their most impressive wins coming over CofC, Furman and Clemson... LAKEITHAALSTON, who averaged 25.0 ppg game this week, ranks 53rd in the NCAA with 18.3 ppg this season... Alston also ranked seventh in the nation witha field goal percentage of .621... The Buccaneers boast the NCAA's 27th-best scoring offense with 77.4 points per game and rank fourth in 3-point field goals with 10.0 per game... CSU hit 18 3-point field goals this week, and stymied their opponents' 3-point game as Clemson and CofC combined for just six buckets from beyond the arc.... HELEN TERRY is also ranked in the NCAA, coming in 21st with 3.6 steals per game after grabbing six on the week ... At 6-2 CSU is off to its best start since the 1998-99 season when they went 7-1 through the first eight games of the season... Alston's 12 field goals made at Clemson is one short of tying the CSU record of 13 set in 2007 by PAM TOLBERT... The Bucs' 16 steals at CofC are a season-high, as are their 5 blocked shots vs. the Cougars... CSU also played some of their best defense this week, allowing a season-low 14 field goals and holding Clemson to just one 3-pointer (.091 %)

COASTAL CAROLINA

COASTAL CARCLINA
Coastal Carolina defeated Coker, 63-53, in its only game of the week ... Coastal improves to 37-0 all-time versus the Cobras dating back to the Chanticleers inaugural season of 1974-75 ... SHANIKA MADDOX scored a career-high ... 19 points and pulled down 12 boards for the second double-double of her career ... KIRA CATER set a career-high with 13 rebounds ... The win was the Chants first after taking a deficit into the intermission ... For the third time this season three Chants scored in double figures with Maddox's 19 points leading the way followed by ANGELICA HENRY's 17 and SHATIA COLES 10 ... This week Coastal Carolina will host Converse on Sunday Dec. 11 at 2

GARDNER-WEBB
The Runnin' Bulldogs are still looking for their first win of the season, as Gardner-Webb suffered a 58-50 home loss to Wofford last Saturday afternoon. Doomed by another very slow start, as Wofford took a 9-0 lead to start the contest, the Runnin' Bulldogs cut the lead to six in the second half, yet struggled down the stretch as the Terriers held on for the eight point non-conference win. Gardner-Webb freshman Eliana Scanlon came off the bench for the Runnin' Bulldogs to score a career-high 19 points and spark the second half comeback. The 50 points is the most that the Runnin' Bulldogs have scored in a single game thus far this season, while the 58 points by Wofford is the least amount of points that GWU has allowed this year. Things to not get any easier for the Runnin' Bulldogs this week, as head coach Rick Reeves and his squad will hit the road to take on the nationally ranked Louisville Cardinals on Saturday, December 10th, at 12 p.m.

HIGH POINT HOWN High Point moved to 4-3 on the season after splitting back-to-back games against BCS opponents. The Panthers picked up an 82-75 win at home over Pittsburgh before falling on the road to No. 22 Vanderbilt by a score of 70-54. Junior ERIN REYNOLDS had a career night against Pitt tying the HPU Div. I single-game scoring record with 36 points in the contest. The guard nearly doubled her previous career high of 20. Senior SHAMIA BROWN and sophomore CHEYENNE PARKER also had good games with double-doubles in the win. HPU then hit the road to take on the nationally-ranked Commodores two days later. High Point fell behind early but managed to battle back to within seven in the second half before falling by 16. Parker led HPU with 19 points and 13 rebounds in the game for her fifth double-double in seven games. ble in seven games.

LIBERTY

LIBERTY
Liberty entered the week ranked No. 24 in the CollegeInsider.com Women's Mid-Major Top 25, but lost a 62-58 home game on Thursday at the hands of James Madison, listed No. 5 in the same poll ... The Lady Flames do not play another game outside Virginia until a Jan. 14 trip to Coastal Carolina ... In the meantime, Liberty has four home games and road tilts at Virginia, Richmond and Radford ... DEVON BROWN needs only seven points to become the 14th 1,000-point scorer in program history ... AVERY WARLEY went over the 1,100-career point mark against James Madison and now has 1,107 career tallies ... Warley is also nearing the 1,000-rebound mark, as the redshirt senior enters the week with 976 career boards ... Liberty will play at Virginia Wednesday at 7 p.m., looking to improve on its 2-1 all-time record incide. Jebn Paul Jacos Kresul. record inside John Paul Jones Arena.

PRESBYTERIAN
Senior KRISTEN STEVENS hit her 118th career three-pointer against USC Upstate on Friday, moving her into sole possession of sixth place in team history. She needs 12 more to tie for fifth place... DRIA DAVID's 11 field throws against USC Upstate set a new Division I-era single game record... MARIAH PIETROWSKIS 21 points against USC Upstate marked the eight-best scoring performance in PC's Division I history and her .800 shooting percentage (8-10) marked the second-best... PC has won back-to-back games for the second time this season, matching last year's tally. A win against Columbia College on December 13 would match the longest win streak in PC's Division I history... Head coach RONNY FISHER captured his 21st career win with PC's victory over USC Upstate, breaking a tie with Jessica Vanco for load coachign wins at PC head coaching wins at PC...

After winning the first four games, Radford has endured back-to-back losses, with this week's loss coming at the hands of Longwood. Despite a 15-0 Longwood run to open the game, Radford battled back in the second half, out-scoring the Lancers 41-32 and brought the score within 14 to close the game. SARAH TABB recorded her first career double-double with all 11 points and 10 of her game-high 11 rebounds coming in the second half. DANARIA ERWIN SPENCER led all scorers with 19, her 11th straight double-figure performance. ASHLEY BUCKHANNON hit double figures for the fifth time in six games this season, as well. Longwood held Radford to just 26 percent shooting (20-76), but Radford once again won the turnover battle and had 19 steals.

UNC ASHEVILLE
UNC Asheville went 0-1 on the week, falling to 73-66 on Nov. 30 at Kimmel Arena. The Bulldogs defeated the Spartans last season, 95-76
at Justice Center. The Bulldogs are now 2-4 overall, 2-1 at home and 0-3 on the road. Junior forward KELLI RILES set a Big South
Conference record Wednesday night when she grabbed a league-record 28 rebounds during the Bulldogs 73-66 loss to USC Upstate. The
28 rebounds was the second most in school history as only SHEILA FORD's 32 rebounds against Gardner-Webb during the 1983-84 season
is higher than Riles effort. Wednesday's game marked the second time Riles had collected more than 20 rebounds this season. The
Bulldogs will host the inaugural Asheville's Collegiate Invitational on Saturday. The event will feature a doubleheader matchup featuring
Southern Conference members Appalachian State and Wofford along with Big South member Radford. The Highlanders will take on
Wofford at 2 p.m. followed by App. State vs. UNC Asheville at 4 p.m. UNC Asheville started the season with an 83-73 victory over WinstonSalem State on Nov. 12. The game was the first basketball game to be played in the brand new Kimmel Arena, UNC Asheville's new home
for men's and women's basketball. The win marked the second year in a row that Asheville has opened the season with a win. Junior forward Kelli Riles started the season with a bang as she tallied 21 points and a then career-high 24 rebounds against the Rams. The 13-of13 effort just misses the school record of 14-of-14 from Tara McMinn set in the 1990-91 season. Riles is the first Asheville player to record
a 20-20 since Sheila Ford accomplished the feat in the 1983-84 season. a 20-20 since Sheila Ford accomplished the feat in the 1983-84 season.

WINTHROP
Winthrop has lost four straight games and is sitting at 2-5 so far this season. Winthrop has played a full NCAA Division I schedule and is one of three conference schools not playing any non-D1 games. Two of Winthrop's losses have come within two points and three of the five losses have been 10 points or less. Four of the seven opponents have winning records and have combined to feature eight preseason all-conference selections. Winthrop will look to end its four-game skid at home against South Carolina State on Dec. 10. As a freshman, DEQUESHA MCCLANAHAN scored 20 or more points in four games. This season, McClanahan has reached at least 20 points in four of the seven games. She is currently averaging 19.4 points and is one of three Lady Eagles averaging double-figures. It's been over 10 years since Winthrop finished a season with three or more players averaging double-figures in scoring. In addition to averaging 19.4 points, McClanahan is also averaging 4.9 rebounds and 6.7 assists per game. Red-shirt freshman SAMIYA WRIGHT has had an impressive start to her career as she's averaging 10.7 points and has scored double-figures in five of her seven games played. She's shooting 48 percent from the field and an impressive 58 percent from behind the arc (11-for-19). She's also 16-for-17 at the foul line.


