#### SEEDS ARE SET

Liberty will go into the 2012 Advance Auto Parts Big South Women's Basketball Championship as the No. 1 seed for the 13th time. High Point picked up the No. 2 seed, while Winthrop will be the No. 3 seed. Campbell is the No. 4 and Charleston is the No. 5 seed. Radford landed the No. 6 position and Coastal Carolina sits in the No. 7 slot. UNC Asheville rounds out the seeds at No.

WINNING THE REBOUND WAR(LEY) Liberty's AVERY WARLEY has taken over No. 1 all-time on the Big South rebounding chart with 1,225... and counting.

NUMBER ONE STUNNER
High Point's SHAMIA BROWN became HPU's Division I scoring leader with her 13 points against Charleston Southern on Jan. 23. She surpassed former teammate JURICA HARGRAVES who set the record last season.

#### RECORD SETTERS

DIANA CHOIBEKOVA tied the Big South single-game record for three-pointers against Gardner-Webb on Jan. 16. The junior cashed in on 10 triples in the contest as she connected on 59 percent of her attempts (10-of-17) ... Also CHEYENNE PARKER tied a Big South single-game record as she recorded 10 blocks vs. Winthrop on Jan. 28.

Winthrop's DIANA CHOIBEKOVA took over the top spot on the single-season three-pointers list as she has cashed in on 119 on the season. She is the only other player in Big South history not named KATIE TULL to post 100-or-more triples in a season ... CHEYENNE PARKER of High Point reset the single-season block standard over the weekend as she now has 108 on the year. Former Radford standout KELLI DARDEN held the record since the 2007-08 season with 98 rejections ... DEQUESHAMCCLANAHAN is No. 1 on the all-time single-season assist list with 220 on the season.

The Lady Flames have established themselves as one of the top rebounding teams in the country. Liberty currently sits at No. 1 in the nation with a 15.9 rebound margin.

#### **BCS BUSTERS**

The first weekend in December proved to be a big one for the Big South Conference. On Friday, Dec. 2, ERIN REYNOLDS of High Point fueled the Panther offense with 36 points to lead High Point to the 82-75 win over Pitt of the Big East ... Two days later, Charleston Southern's LAKEITHA ALSTON posted a 31-point, 10 rebound double-double in the Bucs' 82-77 win over Clemson of

#### THAT'S RIGHT ICE-MAN ... I AM DANGEROUS

Junior guard DIANA CHOIBEKOVA has established herself as one of the League's most dangerous shooters from beyond the arc. She currently ranks No. 1 in all of Division I with 4.0 triples per game. She has also scored in double-digits in 24 games this season and has posted two games with at least 30 points.

DEQUESHA McCLANAHAN is the League's leading scorer with 20.8 points per contest to rank No. 11 in the nation. Scoring isn't the only way McClanahan is generating offense for the Eagles as she is currently ranked No. 4 in the country with 7.3 assists per

High Point's CHEYENNE PARKER has made a name for herself in the post this season. She currently ranks No. 3 in the nation with 3.8 blocked shots per game. Against Winthrop, she tied the Big South single-season standard with 10 blocked shots. She is also currently ranked No. 6 in the country with 17 double-doubles and posted a streak of seven games with 10-or-more rebounds, including a career-best 22 boards against Coastal Carolina on Jan. 21. In the game vs. Winthrop she notched the League's only triple-double this season as she finished with 13 points, 22 rebounds and 10 blocks. As a team, the Panthers are No. 17 in the country with 5.4 blocked shots per game.

#### 20/20

UNC Asheville's KELLI RILES set a new Big South single-game standard for rebounds as she pulled down 28 rebounds in Asheville's win over USC Upstate on Nov. 30. The game marked the second time this season that she has posted a game with 20-or-more rebounds as she pulled down 24 against Winston-Salem State in the opening game of the season ... In the game vs. WSSU, she also became the only player this season with a 20-point, 20-rebound double-double ... Her 10.9 rebounds per game is currently ranked No. 11 in the nation.

The Big South has two student-athletes currently averaging a double-double in points and rebounds this season. High Point's CHEYENNE PARKER is averaging 13.2 points and 12.3 rebounds per game, while AVERY WARLEY of Liberty is averaging 12.7 points and 11.2 boards per game. Parker's rebound average is fourth in the nation, while Warley is ranked 7th.

This season the Big South Conference has had 14 teammates go for 20 points in the same contest. During all of last season the Big South only saw seven sets of teammates go for 20 points in the same game. Radford's DA'NARIA ERWIN SPENCER and ASHLEY BUCKHANNON and DIANA CHOIBEKOVA and DEQUESHA McCLANAHAN have accomplished the output three times on the

### NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

Campbell, who secured the No. 4 seed in the Advance Auto Parts Big South Women's Basketball Championship by winning six of its last seven league games, will take on No. 5 seed Charleston Southern on Friday, March 9. The Lady Camels will tipoff at 2 p.m. in the championship's quarterfinal round following the tournament opener at noon. This season, Campbell rejoined the p.m. in the championship's quarterfinal round following the tournament opener at noon. This season, Campbell rejoined the Big South Conference after a 17 year stay in the Atlantic Sun. Campbell, a founding member of the Big South, was 80-26 in eight seasons (1986-94) in its previous stay, making six consecutive conference tournament finals appearances from 1987-92. Campbell won the 1989 title game, and earned the 1990-91 regular season championship with a perfect 12-0 record in league play. Campbell finished the 2011-12 regular season 18-11, securing the programs most overall wins since 2000-01 when the team posted 22. The team will also finish with a winning record for the first time since that season. This year will be the 20th winning season for Lady Camel head coach WANDA WATKINS, and the 28th overall for the program dating back to 1972-73. In its final weekend before the league championship, Campbell went on the road and swept UNC Asheville (74-55) and Gardner-Webb (64-51). TONISHA BAKER paced the Lady Camels in both games, scoring a career-high 31 at Asheville on Friday before scorching GWU for 25 on Monday night. The junior averaged 28.0 points, 9.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 4.0 steals per game over her last two. Baker, a High Point, N.C. native, also surpassed the 1,000 career point mark on Friday at Asheville, becoming Campbell's 16th player to reach the mark. Baker needs just 11 boards to become Campbell's 19th member of the 500 rebound club.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN
Coach Goodenough has led the Buccaneers to the fifth winning season in school history... Two of the five have come under Coach Goodenough, as the Bucs went 17-14 in 2009-10... Their 16 wins this season are the third-most in school history... The best season in the CSU record books came in 1998-99 when Fred Francello led the Bucs to an 18-10 record... LAKEITHAALSTON will have the opportunity to go for her 1,000th point in the quartefinals of the Big South Tournament... Alston, who led the team the past two games with 20 and 23 poiints, has 990 career points... Alston has led or tied for the team lead in scoring the past four games... She will end the regular season as the team's most accurate shooter, shooting .541... The regular season finale marked RACHELLE COWARD's 17th consecutive game scoring in double figures ... It was also her 12th time this season putting up 20 or more points (she has put up 30+ four times)... Coward has 529 career points in just one season with the Buccaneers... Coward and Alston combined to make 17 free-throws on Monday vs. PC, with Alston going 8-for-10 and Coward sinking 9-of-12... Friday's tilt vs. Winthrop was the third time this season CSU has gone into overtime, giving them a 1-2 record in extra periods... The Bucs previously defeated Furman in OT, but lost to Liberty in double overtime... CSU is 8-5 in OT games since the 2000-01 season. since the 2000-01 season.

#### COASTAL CAROLINA

COASTAL CARCLINA
Coastal Carloina fell in its final two games of the regular season to move to 13-14 overall and 6-12 in Big South play ... Coastal suffered a close setback at Presbyterian (56-52) before going down at Winthrop (84-47) in the season finale ... The Chanticleers are down to only 10 active players after fifth year senior COURTNEY GRAMBLEY was ruled out for the season with an illness ... Senior OLIVIA IRICK and sophomore KAYLA COOK each averaged a team-high 10 points on the week ... KATELYN CONNOR scored a career-high nine points and tallied a career-high three blocks against Winthrop ... The Chants totaled 14 blocks on the week with TAYLOR EPLEY leading the way with six to up her single season career-best total to 32 ... Coastal is the No. 7 seed in the Big South Tournament and will play No. 2 seeded High Point on Friday at 5:30 p.m. ... The Chants last victory in the conference tournament came by way of a 52-44 defeat of Charleston Southern in the quarterfinal round of the 2010 tournament.

GARDNER-WEBB
The Runnin' Bulldogs season came to an end this past week, as GWU suffered back-to-back home losses to High Point and Campbell to finish the season at 4-25 overall and 3-15 in conference play. Gardner-Webb's 3-15 conference record placed them in a tie with UNC Asheville, however, the Asheville Bulldogs held the tiebreaker over the Runnin Bulldogs and thus received the eighth and final spot in this week's 2012 Advance Auto Parts Big South Women's Basketball Championship Tournament. GWU battled High Point on Friday night for the first 34 minutes of the game and found themselves down five with 6:03 to go in the contest. #### UNC ASHEVILLE

UNC Asheville went 0-2 on the week with losses to Campbell and High Point this past weekend. The Bulldogs are now 7-22 overall and 3-15 in Big South games. The Bulldogs are also now 7-8 at home and 0-14 on the road. This season marks the worst road record for the Bulldogs since going 1-11 in away contests during the 2009-10 season. The Bulldogs game against Winthrop on Feb. 13 senior guard LINDSEY THOMPSON scored her 1,000th career point. The Bulldogs also set the team record for 3-pointers in a game against WU, scoring 14 in the contest. Junior guard GRACE BLAYLOCK set the UNC Asheville record for 3-pointers in a game with seven against Winthrop on Jan. 14, 2012. Freshman guard Shonese Jones has been named the Big South Freshman of the Week and the Big South Freshman of the Week four times. LEAH WORMACK has been named the Big South Freshman of the Week three times on the season. Thompson set the UNC Asheville record for career 3-pointers against George Mason on 11/27. She now has 200 for her career, breaking the record of Brittany Hendley, who played for the Bulldogs from 2003-07. KELLI RILES now has 742 rebounds, which ranks sixth all time at UNC Asheville, and is the seventh player in school history to grab more than 700 rebounds.

#### WINTHROP

Winthrop posted back-to-back 80 point games over the weekend en route to a 2-0 record to end the regular season with a league record of 12-6. The 12 wins are a school record for conference wins and the team now has a school NCAA Division I high nine 80-plus games on the year. It was the second time this season Winthrop posted back-to-back games in the 80's. The 18 wins on the year are tied for the third most in a season in school history. The school record is 20 set by the 2007-08 team with the 1973-74 team second with 19 wins. Only one other squad won at least 18 games in a season, which was in 1976-77. Winthrop head coach MARLENE STOLLINGS also set a record for first-year coaches at Winthrop when the team won its 17th on Friday vs. Charleston Southern. With the win over Coastal Carolina on Monday, the Eagles captured their 10th home win of the season. That number ties the school's NCAA Div. 1 record, with 11 wins being the record all-time. Freshman SAMIYA WRIGHT set career-highs in points both Friday and Monday as he posted 26 points and followed that with a 30-point performance on Monday. She moved into second on the freshman scoring list and she moved into first on the freshman list in minutes played. She finishes the regular season averaging 13.4 points. With her 30-point performance on Monday, she became the third different Winthrop player this season to score in the 30's. That's never been done before in school history. Wright has 21 games in double-figures. Senior TAQUOIA HAMMICK joined Winthrop's 500/500 club after passing 500 career points on Monday in the win over Coastal. She's got 563 career rebounds. The game against Coastal Carolina also saw the Eagles place two players with 20 or more points in a game for the sixth time on the season. DEQUESHA MCCLANNAHAN broke the Big South Conference single-season record for assists on Friday and now has 220 on the year. The old record was 207 set by Radford's Stephanie Howard. McClanahan passed the 1,000 career mark on Monday in the first half against Coastal


